Report Highlights –2013 Q1 Staff Report

1. Letter from Executive Director & Executive Summary Report

The details included in the 2013 Q1 Staff Report are intended to communicate project status, analyze market trends and communicate performance metrics.

2. <u>Program Forecast Report</u>

This report has been developed for distribution to the Board, clients and MBE/WBE Assistance Agencies as well as prospective bidders to share upcoming opportunities and milestones for projects in Planning, Design, and Construction.

3. Market Conditions Report

This graphic illustrates comparative costs of like buildings, thereby tracking market trends.

4. Program Cost Status Report

As of March 29, 2013, current multi-year program authority exceeds \$2.3B in project development cost. Currently, projects are under budget by 7.88%, representing a variance of \$184.9MM under the original undertaking budgets. A limited number of budget revisions have been authorized due to changes in project scope. Including these revisions, projects are under budget by 8.30%, representing a variance of \$196MM under the revised undertaking budgets.

The PBC works closely with User Agency Staff throughout the development of a project to ensure that only the funds necessary to complete a project are raised.

5. Program Cost Effectiveness Report

Recognizing the need to be good stewards of the public fund, in addition to getting competitive construction bids and managing projects to approved budgets, additional areas of focus include managing change orders and indirect project costs:

Open Projects Construction Change Order Q1 2013 Report

The approved change order % for construction projects is 2.5%. The projected change order % for all construction contracts is 4.7%, including potential change orders and those in process. These rates are below the industry standard change order percentage for new municipal and educational construction work at 3-5%.

Indirect Costs as a Percentage of Construction Costs

The PBC tracks all project costs throughout the life of a project, including all Indirect Costs, also known as "soft costs" (Planning, Environmental Testing & Consulting, Design, and Program and Project Management) and all Construction Costs, also known as "hard costs" (Demolition, Site Prep, Utility Relocation and General Construction).

The PBC's Indirect Costs average **16.29%** of Construction costs. The PBC's Indirect Costs are particularly cost effective on large scale projects and programs, averaging 12.33% of construction costs on projects where construction is \$50M or higher. This is consistently below the industry average of 25%.

6. Monthly Project Status Report

This report provides an individual detailed snapshot of every active PBC project.

7. Sustainable Development Q1 2013 Status Report

This report provides a detailed snapshot of the PBC's LEED certified projects and metrics. Through Q1 2013, the PBC has achieved LEED Certification on 53 municipally owned projects, with an additional 25 registered projects. The City of Chicago has more LEED certified municipally owned facilities than any other city in the nation.

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This report provides a detailed snapshot of the PBC's LEED certified projects and metrics. Through Q1 2013, the PBC has achieved LEED Certification on 53 municipally owned projects, with an additional 25 registered projects. The City of Chicago has more LEED certified municipally owned facilities than any other city in the nation.

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Mission

The Public Building Commission is committed to client service and strong stewardship of public resources. The PBC plans, designs and builds facilities that reflect the highest standards of environmental and economic sustainability.

Vision

The vision of the Public Building Commission is a built environment in which function, beauty and sustainability are inherent to every community; where physical surroundings inspire and support achievement of the individual goals of those who live, work and visit Chicago and Cook County; and, where people gather to share the common values that truly build our communities.

Sustainability Program

In line with this mission and vision, the Public Building Commission of Chicago (PBC) has developed 53 LEED certified facilities, with an additional 25 LEED registered projects in development., and is implementing a program to install Energy Conservation Measures across a broad range of City of Chicago facilities.

Retrofit Chicago

PBC is implementing a multi-agency energy performance contract program, utilizing three Energy Service Companies (ESCOs) to reduce energy use and carbon footprint across the City of Chicago building portfolio. A part of broader Sustainable Chicago program, the program leverages long term energy cost savings to pay for energy-related capital improvements - Energy Conservation Measures (ECMs) - that achieve significant long term savings that can be measured and verified. Funding ECMs through this vehicle allows improvements to be implemented with no capital outlay. Rebates and other incentives may be used to pay down financing through the ESCOs.

A preliminary feasibility study was issued November 2012, after analysis of 238 City of Chicago facilities by 3 ESCOs. Investment Grade Energy Audits were performed on 136 of these facilities. As of Q1 2013, audits are complete, and over 200 energy-related capital improvement projects at approximately 70 buildings have been identified for ESCO implementation under a guaranteed performance contract. Per current projections, a \$20-25 million program is indicated, which could be expected to save up to \$2 million in annual utility energy costs alone, with additional operations and maintenance benefits also expected. Final Program is subject to results of Chicago Infrastructure Trust financing proposals.

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On February 9, 2010, the Public Building Commission (PBC) received Board approval to award sixty-six (66) term contracts, on March 8, 2011, the PBC received Board approval to award an additional thirty-one (31) term contracts to firms pre-qualified to provide consulting services. On January 8, 2013, the PBC reported to the Board the extension of sixty-four (64) term contracts with one firm not accepting the renewal extension and one joint venture had dissolved in the following categories: Surveying, Commissioning, Environmental Categories A, B and C, Environmental Renovation / Demolition, Geotechnical, Traffic Study and Construction Inspection and Material Testing as follows:

In September 2011, a random lottery by category was conducted to establish the rotation to accommodate the recent addition of firms. As services are required, the rotation determines the firm to which a Request for Pricing is issued. Proposals are reviewed and evaluated for experience, expertise of staff, capacity, past performance, plan of action proposed and pricing. Upon approval, PBC staff issues a task order against the successful firm's term contract.

In the 1st quarter of 2013, twelve (12) task orders valuing \$295,170.19 were issued against the Specialty Consultant term contracts. Of that total dollar value, 35% of the dollars were issued to MBE firms and 28% to WBE firms.
