EVALUATION OVERVIEW

I. EVALUATION PROCESS

Public Building Commission of Chicago ("PBC") representatives will review the submitted Statements of Qualifications in accordance with the evaluation criteria set forth herein. PBC representatives may request additional documentation and may request to meet with Respondent to verify qualifications and capability and capacity to successfully perform as general contractor for the subject projects. After evaluating all relevant information, PBC representatives will determine which Respondents are eligible for pre-qualification. The Executive Director will identify eligible firms in a report to the PBC Board of Commissioners. Once approved, Respondents will be notified.

The PBC reserves the right to reject any and all Statements of Qualifications and to waive any informality in the submittals whenever it determines such rejection or waiver is in its best interest.

The PBC reserves the right to cancel this pre-qualification process whenever the best interest of the PBC is served. The PBC shall not be liable for costs incurred by Respondents associated with this procurement process.

II. PRE-QUALIFICATION OF JOINT VENTURES

A. Minority-owned and Women-owned Business (MBE/WBE) Participation

It is the PBC's policy to provide for maximum contracting opportunities for MBE/WBEs on all PBC projects and MBE/WBEs are encouraged to apply to be pre-qualified to bid as general contractors on the Harbor projects.

The PBC also strongly encourages the participation of MBEs and WBEs as joint venture general contractors. Therefore, the PBC permits contractors who are pre-qualified through this process to bid as joint ventures with MBE/WBE contractors. The joint venture can be established after the pre-qualification process is concluded (but before the bid is due). The MBE/WBE joint venture partner does *not* need to be pre-qualified; however the firm with controlling interest in the joint venture must be pre-qualified.

Joint ventures of MBE/WBE contractors and non-MBE/WBE contractors are also invited to apply directly for pre-qualification.

B. Evaluating Joint Venture Qualification

Joint ventures of contractors with appropriate qualifications, financial capacity and combined construction experience and capacity are eligible to be considered for this pre-qualification. Joint ventures applying for pre-qualification must complete and submit separate Parts I., III., and IV. for *each* joint venture partner. A completed Part I. General Information must also be submitted for the joint venture entity; and Respondent must submit a copy of the entity's joint venture agreement which clearly identifies the resources, capabilities and capacity of each joint venture firm available to be allocated to the performance of the Harbor Project.

III. EVALUATION CRITERIA

The PBC shall review and evaluate the Statements of Qualifications of each Respondent in accordance with the following criteria:

A. Technical Competence and Specific Past Performance

- 1. Gateway Harbor. Eligible contractors must possess verifiable experience and demonstrate successful past performance on comparable public or private Great Lakes coastal projects with construction costs of \$20,000,000 or more. Only experience on comparable projects completed in the last 10 years on which Respondent performed as a general contractor will be considered. Eligible contractors must, at a minimum, have successfully performed on two or more comparable coastal projects that included features such as driven sheet piling, rubble mound breakwaters and floating docks.
- 2. 31st Street Harbor (Landside/Marina Project). Eligible contractors must possess verifiable experience and demonstrate successful past performance on comparable public or private projects with construction costs of \$30,000,000 or more. Only experience on comparable projects completed in the last 10 years on which Respondent performed as a general contractor will be considered. Eligible contractors must, at a minimum, have successfully performed on two or more comparable marina projects.
- 3. 31st Street Harbor (Coastal Project). Eligible contractors must possess verifiable experience and demonstrate successful past performance on comparable public or private Great Lakes coastal projects with construction costs of \$10,000,000 or more. Only experience on comparable projects completed in the last 10 years on which Respondent performed as a general contractor or as a specialty breakwater subcontractor will be considered. Eligible contractors must, at a minimum, have successfully performed on two or more comparable coastal projects that included features such as rubble mound breakwaters and procurement and transportation of large quantities of stone.

B. Past Performance: General

Eligible contractors must demonstrate successful past performance as a general contractor on PBC projects or projects successfully completed for other government agencies or private owners. Evidence of successful past performance will demonstrate Respondent's ability to successfully construct, administer, manage, schedule, and coordinate projects in order to control cost, ensure quality and comply with contract requirements. Respondent's history regarding defaults or terminations on projects; failure to complete projects on schedule; litigation history, including judgments and outstanding lawsuits; and violation of laws is all relevant to the evaluation of this criterion. The PBC may solicit relevant information concerning the firm's record of past performance from current and past clients or any available resources.

C. Qualifications and Relevant Experience of Management Staff

Eligible contractors must employ and have available appropriately qualified and experienced personnel (Project Manger, Superintendents, Scheduler, Quality Control Manager, Safety Manager) as needed to provide required management services on these projects.

D. Minority and Women Owned Business Participation

Eligible contractors must have a positive history of achieving M/WBE participation commitments on previous projects.

E. Equal Employment Opportunity and City of Chicago Residency Participation

Eligible contractors must have a positive history of achieving commitments made to employ minority, female and Chicago resident labor on previous projects.

F. Financial Capacity, Bonding Capacity and Licensing

Eligible contractors must have demonstrated financial resources, bonding capacity and licenses necessary to successfully complete the project work.

G. Safety Program

Eligible contractors must demonstrate the quality of their overall safety program as evidenced by their history of citations, OSHA incident rate and Experience Modification Rate (EMR).

We have reviewed the Request for Qualifications for General Contractors (RFQ) for Gateway and 31st Street Harbor Construction Work, understand the conditions, and hereby request to be found eligible for pre-qualification for the Public Building Commission of Chicago.

1. [___] GATEWAY HARBOR

Program: New 240-slip marina to be constructed immediately south of Navy Pier. Existing Dime Pier will be encapsulated in a double row of steel sheet piling and capped with concrete. Two new steel sheet breakwaters comprised of a vertical steel wall on the harbor side and armor stone on the lake side will be constructed as will one new rubble mound stone stub breakwater. A 1.4 acre lakefill will be constructed to connect Dime Pier to land. The fill will include a vertical steel wall on its north side and sloping rubble on the lake side to the east. Relieving platform piers will be constructed adjacent to Navy Pier. Project includes installation of floating docks, utility connections and fueling facilities. Marina amenities include a two-story, 200-person dockside restaurant, landfill, commercial boat piers, harbor services building, utilities, roads, atgrade parking and landscaping. (See *Exhibit A, Concept Plan for Chicago Gateway Harbor*.)

Construction Schedule: Completion by May 1, 2011

Construction Budget: \$33 - \$48 million

Technical Competence and Specific Past Performance:

- Eligible contractors must possess verifiable experience and demonstrate successful past performance on comparable public or private coastal projects with construction costs of \$20,000,000 or more.
- Only experience on comparable projects completed in the last 10 years on which Respondent performed as a general contractor will be considered.
- Eligible contractors must, at a minimum, have successfully performed on two or more comparable
 coastal projects that included features such as driven sheet piling, rubble mound breakwaters and
 floating docks.

2. [___] 31st STREET HARBOR: Landside/Marina Project

Landside Program: New Community Building/Restaurant/Marina Facility. The project's two-story restaurant/community building will be integral with a 335-space, Green roof parking garage. Two-thirds of the parking space in the garage will be available for heated winter boat storage. Project also includes an expanded play ground; community plaza; and exterior at-grade parking with between 80 and 240 parking spaces. Site development includes extensive hard and soft landscaping, access roads and underground storage tank. The project includes installation of floating docks and utility connections for 830 boat slips and a fuel dock with associated fuel storage facilities. Dock utilities include an at-slip sewage pump system. Project may include modifications to Lake Shore Drive intersection at 31st Street and construction of Lake Shore Trail underpass. (See *Exhibit B, Concept Plan for 31st Street Harbor.*)

Construction Schedule: Completion by May 1, 2012

Construction Budget: \$55 - \$73 million

Technical Competence and Specific Past Performance:

- Eligible contractors must possess verifiable experience and demonstrate successful past performance on comparable public or private marina projects with construction costs of \$30,000,000 or more.
- Only experience on comparable projects completed in the last 10 years on which Respondent performed as a general contractor will be considered.
- Eligible contractors must, *at a minimum*, have successfully performed on two or more comparable marina projects.

NOTICE: PBC Option to Combine Landside/Marina and Coastal Projects

The Public Building Commission may, in its sole discretion, elect to bid and award the 31st Street Harbor: Landside/Marina Project and 31st Street Harbor: Coastal Project as a single combined project.

If the PBC elects to bid and award the projects together in a single bid package, then **ONLY** firms pre-qualified to bid on the 31st Street Harbor: Landside/Marina Project will be eligible to bid on the 31st Street Harbor: <u>Combined Landside/Marina/Coastal Project</u>.

Also, if the PBC elects to bid and award the projects together in a single bid package, then the Contractor awarded the 31st Street Harbor: <u>Combined Landside/Marina/Coastal Project</u> will be required, by the Contract Documents, to subcontract the breakwater work to one of the firms pre-qualified for the 31st Street Harbor: Coastal Project.

3. [___] 31st STREET HARBOR: Coastal Project

Program: 2,700 lineal foot rubble mound breakwater for protection of the new 31st Street Harbor and a 250 lineal foot stub breakwater at the harbor mouth to protect a new 830 slip marina. Park and play lawn, Lake Michigan overlook, and landscaped terrace steps. *Approximate Breakwater Stone Quantities:* Armor Stone - 215,000 Tons; Underlayer Stone - 112,000 Tons; Core Stone - 225,000 Tons. Construction Schedule: Completion by October 1, 2011

Construction Budget: \$17,000,000

Technical Competence and Specific Past Performance:

- Eligible contractors must possess verifiable experience and demonstrate successful past performance on comparable public or private coastal projects with construction costs of \$10,000,000 or more.
- Only experience on comparable projects completed in the last 10 years on which Respondent performed as a either coastal project general contractor or a specialty breakwater subcontractor as a will be considered.
