# **QUESTIONS & ANSWERS**

- Q1. On partial West Elevation 41/A4.1, section cut 56/A5.3 calls for fascia/coping to be per Detail 11/A6.2 per the Roof Plan A1.3. Also Detail 1/A6.5 references the same condition. Which is correct?
- A1. Both details are correct. As explained in the Tech Review Meeting, and on the drawings, one series is for wall construction (A6.1 thru A6.4, titled "wall details"), the other is for roof construction (A6.5 thru A6.8, titled "roof details").
- Q2. Section 07415 Composite Wall Panels page 6: 5 manufacturers are listed as approved. 3 of the manufacturers make the panel facing skins to be 0.020" -Alucobond, Reynobond and Alpolitic. Centria "can" make the panels with facings of 0.032", but they can only manufacture in 8mm panel thickness. Alucobond, Reynobond and Alpolitic manufacture in 4mm panel thickness. Is a 4mm panel with 0.020 facing approved?
- A2. The 0.020 "skin" is acceptable. Overall panel thickness is a function of meeting structural performance requirements. See Addendum No 3 "Changes to Book 3: TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS Change 2"
- Q3. We would appreciate your clarification of the following item at your earliest convenience. Part 1.5 of specification section 05120, Structural Steel, calls for the shop paint applicator (steel fabricator) to carry AISC's, "Sophisticated Paint Endorsement P1 or SSPC-QP3." There are only (3) steel fabricators in the state of Illinois that carry this paint endorsement. Please consider removing this requirement in order to receive more competitive pricing.
- A.3 The requirement can be deleted. See Addendum No 3 "Changes to <u>Book 3: TECHNICAL SPECIFICATIONS</u> Change 1"

Questions 4 thru 9 refer to the Furniture System, see sheets A16.1 and A16.2

- Q4. Rm A148 the F-5's shown have double the amount of tags. Have these quantities increased or is this duplication? What should the ultimate number be for this office?
- A4. The tags are duplicated. Quantity of four as shown dotted on the plan is correct.
- Q5. Rm A102 PD-1, CPU Cradles, and Monitor Arms We do not see tags for these on the plan. Can you share the quantities or areas these are needed?
- A5. See Detail 21/A8.4 as keyed on Sheet A16.1.
- Q6. Rm A134 This room has been switched from the original plan of an Officer's Quarters to a Hazmat Office. Currently your notes show a duplication of the Deputy Chief office. Should we continue this detail/level for the Hazmat office or will this be a shared office more similar to the standards of the Assistant deputy chief?
- A6. Provide furniture as indicated.
- Q7 Rm A102 -Tag F-1 seems to be missing from the plan. With this detail (galaxy front) it should be located in either the Fire station side or the Officers qtr. Is there a quantity for this or an old tag?
- A7. See Detail 21/A8.4 as keyed on Sheet A16.1.
- Tag WT-1 is noted as a 2" common top over filing. This is located in the Officers qtrs. Currently all tops in that area should be the 1 3/16" top verses the 2". We would like to substitute for the 1 3/16" to keep with the consistency and lower cost. Is this acceptable?

- A8. Provide top as specified.
- Q9. Rm A102 Are there to be tags for this area or a blow up plan? There are chairs shown with no tags. Are these to be included? (Tag C-1)
- A9. See Detail 21/A8.4 as keyed on Sheet A16.1.

# Questions 10 thru15 refer to Building Signage

- Q10. Please clarify the finish, ie: CI, Anodized or Baked enamel, for the exterior cast aluminum letters shown on sheets A 3.1 and A6. 3.
- A10. Finish to be satin aluminum.
- Q11. Please provide the size for the "Emergency Medical Services" vinyl letters and logo shown of sheet A3.1
- A11. Sizes clarified in Addendum No. 2.
- Q12 Please provide size, materials, finish for the LEED Plagues shown on sheet A8.8
- A12. Size to be 14" x 18". Finish to be the same as the dedication plague on detail 33/A8.7.
- Q13 Please provide the height and depth of the stainless steel letters shown on sheet A8.6.
- All the letters on Det 31/A8.6 to be 3" high as noted. Depth of letters to be ½".
- Q14 For Section 10140 Signage, Paragraphs 2.4.A.2 and 2.4.A.8 please clarify if frames are to be provided and if so the material and the finish for them.
- A14 "All the signs are "frameless". Sign types A and B are "Room Signs. Sign type C is a "Toilet Room Sign". Sign types D thru R are "Identification Signs".
- Q15 For Section 10140 Signage, Paragraphs 2.4.C please provide the locations on the plans.
- A15. The sign locations are indicated on sheet A13.1
- Q16. For Fire station 16, the ITB documents clearly lays out the State of Illinois Prevailing Wages are the wage rates applicable to this project. Addendum #1 introduces Federal Davis Bacon Wages into the project documents. Does Federal Davis Bacon override State of Illinois PW or are the Federal Davis in addition to the State Wages? It does not appear that the introduction of Federal Wages overrides the state wages.
- A16. See Addendum no. 3, Change to Book 1, Project Information, Instructions to Bidders, and Execution Documents, changes #1 and #2 above.

If the response from this initial contact is not satisfactory, then the process described in 2.) and 3.) should be followed.

With regard to any other matter not yet ripe for the formal process described here, initial contact should be with the Branch of Construction Wage Determinations. Write to:
