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III. PROPOSAL SUPPORT DOCUMENTS

A. Basis of Award (Award Criteria)

To promote the intended goal of economic opportunity and maximize the use of minority personnel on this project, the Public Building Commission of Chicago has established the Award Criteria formula for the purpose of evaluating proposals and awarding the contract. A contract in the amount of the total Base Bid or Base Contract Price will be awarded to the responsible bidder with the lowest Award Criteria Figure. The Public Building Commission of Chicago reserves the right to check all calculations for accuracy. The fulfillment of the Award Criteria does not abrogate the responsibilities of the Contractor to comply with federal and state requirements under the Equal Employment Act and the Illinois Human Rights Act.

1. Instructions

The Bidder shall complete the Award Criteria Formula and transfer the final Award Criteria Figure - Line 15 to the space provided on the itemized proposal sheet. Failure to complete the formula may be cause for rejection of the Bidder's proposal. The successful bidder will be held responsible for adhering to the figures submitted in Lines 1, 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 and 12 during construction of the project.

Lines 2, 4 and 6 in the formula shall not be greater than fifty percent (50%) in each category for the sole purpose of determining award of the contract. Similarly, lines 8, 10 and 12 shall not be greater than ten (10%) percent in each category for the purpose of award criteria only. The fifty percent (50%) and ten percent (10%) goals are not intended to restrict the total number of minority and female employees to be used on the project, but only to establish limiting figures for use in the formula. Journeyworker includes journeyworkers from the major trades listed herein, and the teamsters. Watchmen and custodial workers are not creditable in the formula.

3. Community Hiring Bonuses

In order to encourage maximum employment of interested and available residents of the project community on this project, the following bonus calculations shall apply:

- a) In calculating the hours worked by minority and women journeyworkers, apprentices, and laborers under the Award Criteria set out in Part III.A. "Basis of Award (Award Criteria)," all hours worked by minority and women journeyworkers, existing apprentices, and laborers who are residents of the project community shall be multiplied by 1.5.
- b) In calculating the hours worked by minority and women apprentices under the Award Criteria set out in Part III "Proposal Support Documents," all hours worked in new apprenticeships by minority and women apprentices who are residents of the project community shall be multiplied by 2.0.

Definitions

"Actual residents of the City of Chicago" shall mean persons domiciled within the City of Chicago. The domicile is an individual's one and only true, fixed, and permanent home and principal establishment.

"Residents of the project community" shall mean persons domiciled within the Ward in which the Site is located.

"New Apprenticeship" shall mean an apprenticeship begun for a person who has not held an apprenticeship card within ninety (90) days prior to beginning the project.

4. Liquidated Damages

The Contractor hereby consents and agrees that, in the event that it fails to comply with each of the minimum commitments submitted with this Proposal on Lines 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, and 12 of the Award Criteria Formula, covering minority and female Journeyworkers, apprentices, and laborers respectively, the following shall apply.

If the total hours in any category for which a percentage is assigned in Lines 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, or 12 of the Award Criteria equals zero at the completion of the work, then a net deficiency of the entire percentage assigned will be deemed to exist. For any net deficiency in each category, the following amounts shall be deducted as liquidated damages from monies due the Contractor and the Contract Sum modified accordingly:

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a) For each full one (1%) percent deficiency of minority Journeyworkers not utilized – seventeen and ninety three hundredths cents per each hundred dollars of the base bid calculated as follows:

Line 1 x 0.1793

Each one (1%) percent deficiency toward the goal for female Journeyworkers (Line 8) shall be calculated in the same way.

b) For each full one (1%) percent deficiency of minority apprentices not utilized – sixteen and ninety three hundredths cents per hundred dollars of the base bid calculated as follows:

> Line 1 x 0.1693 100

Each one (1%) percent deficiency toward the goal for female apprentices (Line 10) shall be calculated in the same way.

c) For each one (1%) percent deficiency of minority laborers not utilized – fourteen and ninety three hundredths cents per each hundred dollars of the base bid calculated as follows:

Line 1 x 0.1493 100

Each one (1%) percent deficiency toward the goal for female laborers (Line 12) shall be calculated in the same way.

- d) Liquidated damages, if any, will be calculated for the first pay requests reflecting fifty percent (50%) completion, seventy-five percent (75%) completion, and ninety percent (90%) completion, respectively, based upon the Contractor's pay request together with all attendant certified payrolls and other required documentation of minority and women employment. The accrued liquidated damages and interest will be added to the retention provided elsewhere in this contract. The amount of liquidated damages due to the Commission under this provision will bear compound interest at the rate of 5% per annum, compounded monthly from the date of the Notice to Proceed to the date of approval of a deductive change order for liquidated damages. Should the total amount of liquidated damages due under all provisions of this contract exceed the amount of the Commission's retainage, compound interest on the amount over and above the retainage will continue to accrue until the entire amount of liquidated damages and compound interest is paid to the Commission.
- e) The Commission is aware that certain subcontract agreements under this contract may require subcontractors to contribute to payment of liquidated damages assessed under this provision. Should enforcement of subcontract liquidated damages provisions result in an aggregate total of subcontractor liquidated damages greater than the liquidated damages assessed hereunder against Contractor, then Contractor must pay the excess pro rata as a bonus to each subcontractor exceeding its subcontract commitments for minority or women employment, or both.

5. Reporting

In accordance with this commitment, the Contractor must submit both the Contractor's Payroll Record Form and the Contractor's Recapitulation of Minority and Female Worker Hours and Percentages Form on a monthly basis. All Subcontractors shall be listed on the Contractor's Recapitulation Form whether active or not. For the purpose of this report, the following group categories will be used:

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- The classification "White" includes person of Indo-European descent.
- b) The classification "Black" or "African-American" includes persons having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.
- c) The classification "Hispanic" includes persons whose origins are from Mexico, Puerto Rico, Cuba, Central or South America, the Caribbean Islands or other Spanish culture or origin, regardless of race.
- d) The classification "Native American" includes persons who are Native Americans by virtue of tribal association.
- e) The classification "Asian-Pacific" includes persons whose origins are from East Asia, Southeast Asia, the Pacific Islands or the Indian sub-continent.
- f) The classification "Other" includes qualified individuals with disabilities who meet legitimate skill, experience, education or other requirements of employment positions held or sought and who perform the essential function with or without reasonable accommodation and other groups or other individuals found by the Public Building Commission of Chicago to be socially and economically disadvantaged and to have suffered actual racial or ethnic discrimination and decreased opportunities to compete in Chicago area markets.

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V. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

A. Examination Of Documents By Bidder

- 1. The Bidder shall, before submitting its bid, carefully examine all Contract Documents, including but not limited to, the Standard Terms and Conditions (Book 1); Project Information, Instructions, and Execution Documents (Book 2); Technical Specifications (Book 3); plans; drawings; Addenda (if any); and bonds. The Bidder shall inspect in detail the site of the proposed Work and familiarize itself with all the local conditions affecting the Contract and the detailed requirements of construction. If its bid is accepted, the bidder will be responsible for all errors in its proposal resulting from failure or neglect to comply with these instructions. In no case will the Commission be responsible for any change in anticipated profits resulting from such failure or neglect.
- 2. Unless otherwise provided in the Contract, when the plans or specifications include information pertaining to subsurface exploration, borings, test pits, and other preliminary investigation, such information represents the opinion of the Commission as to the location, character, or quantity of the materials encountered and is only included for the convenience of the Bidder. The Commission assumes no responsibility with respect to the sufficiency or accuracy of the information, and there is no guaranty, either expressed or implied, that the conditions indicated are representative of those existing throughout the work, or that unanticipated developments may not occur.

B. Interpretations Or Addenda

- 1. The Commission will not furnish oral interpretations of Contract Documents. If an interpretation is desired by a prospective Bidder, the interpretation should be requested in a letter addressed to the Owner's Representative named in the Advertisement for Bids. Any inquiry received ten (10) or more days prior to the date fixed for opening of bids will be considered. Every interpretation or revision will be in the form of an addendum to the Contract Documents and, when issued, will be on file in the office of the Commission at least five (5) days before bids are opened. Although all addenda will be mailed to each person obtaining Contract Documents, it shall be the Bidder's responsibility to inquire as to the addenda issued. Notice of pre-qualification has been provided by the Commission to all firms approved as "pre-qualified," and only firms that have received notification of pre-qualification are eligible to bid on this Contract. Moreover, a firm that has been pre-qualified as a separate entity (e.g.

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sole proprietor, partnership, or corporation) is not eligible to submit a bid for this Contract as a joint venture with another pre-qualified firm unless such joint venture has been notified of its pre-qualification.

2. - The guarantee shall be made by bid bond, certified check or cashier's check payable to the order of the Public Building Commission of Chicago. No bid will be considered unless it is accompanied by the required guarantee. Cash deposits will not be accepted.
- 3. The Bidder agrees that this bid may be held by the Commission for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days from the date fixed for the opening of bids and that the bid may not be withdrawn within that period.
- 4. If written notice of the acceptance of this Bid is mailed, telegraphed or delivered to the undersigned within the time noted herein, or at any time thereafter before this Bid is withdrawn, the undersigned agrees to enter into a Contract with the Public Building Commission of Chicago with the Bid as accepted. The undersigned agrees to give a Performance and Payment Bond as specified in the Contract Documents, with good and sufficient surety or sureties, and to furnish the required insurance, all within five (5) days after given Notice of Award.

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5. The bid bonds, certified checks, or cashier's checks of unsuccessful Bidders will be returned as soon as practicable after the opening of the bids; however, the deposits of the three (3) lowest Bidders shall be retained until the Commission awards the Contract to one of them, or for any reason rejects all bids.

I. Administrative Fee

Each Bidder must submit with its bid a certified or cashiers' check in the amount set forth in Part I.A. "Administrative Fee" as an administrative fee for processing and handling of non-responsive bids. Upon award of the contract, the successful Bidder's check, and the checks of all Bidders whose bids are determined by the Commission to have been responsive, shall be returned to the Bidders submitting them. Should one or more bids be rejected by the Commission as non-responsive, the checks from the non-responsive Bidder or Bidders shall be deposited in the general funds of the Commission as an administrative fee to compensate the Commission for the costs of processing and handling the non-responsive bid or bids.

J. Bidder's Execution of Bid

- 1. The Bidder must execute the Bid in two (2) original counterparts.
- 2. Bids must be submitted with original signatures in the space provided on the appropriate Part II.B. "Acceptance of the Bid." Bids not properly signed shall be rejected.
- 3. If Bidder is a corporation, the President and Secretary must execute the bid and the Corporate seal must be affixed. In the event that this bid is executed by other than the President, attach hereto a certified copy of that section of the Corporate By-Laws or other authorization by the Corporation that permits the person to execute the offer for said corporation.
- 4. If Bidder is a partnership, all partners must execute the bid, unless one partner has been authorized to sign for the partnership, in which case, evidence of such authority satisfactory to the Commission must be submitted.
- 5. If Bidder is a sole proprietorship, the sole proprietor must execute the bid.
- 6. A "Partnership," "Joint Venture," or "Sole Proprietorship" operating under an Assumed Name must be registered with the Illinois county in which it is located, as provided in 805 ILCS 405 (1992).

K. Basis of Award (Award Criteria)

The Bidder shall complete the figures in the Award Criteria Formula to compute the Award Criteria Figure and complete the Trade Participation information. Such information shall be attached to the bid on the form provided. All calculations will be verified pursuant to instructions provided in the form.

L. Alternates

The Bidder shall indicate a price for each and every Alternate, if any, described in the Contract Documents.

M. Unit Prices

- 1. The Bidder is required to complete the Unit Prices form in its entirety.
- Unit prices provided may be used as the basis for adjustments to the Contract Price in the event that the
 quantities of Work required by the Contract Documents are increased or decreased. However, the
 Commission reserves the right to negotiate the Unit Prices.

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3. Unit Prices shall be inclusive of the cost of materials, work, layout, drafting, balancing and testing, tools and sundries, overhead and profit, supervision, and any and all other costs of whatsoever nature in connection therewith for work in place and accepted or omitted as the case may be. The calculation for determining the number of units of work shall be actual surface, volume, length, hours, and number of individual items listed for the class of work complete in place and accepted or omitted. No allowance for waste, loss, breakage, damage, or difficulties shall be made.

N. Affidavit of Non-Collusion

Each Bidder shall fully execute an affidavit, in the form provided, to the effect that the Bidder has not colluded with any other person, firm, or corporation in regard to any bid submitted. Such affidavit shall be attached to the bid.

O. MBE and WBE Commitments

Pursuant to Article 23 "MBE/WBE Special Conditions, each Bidder shall submit with its Bid affidavits and supporting documents describing the extent to which Minority Business Enterprise ("MBE") and Women Business Enterprise ("WBE") firms will participate in the Contract.

P. Affidavit of Uncompleted Work

The Bidder is required to submit a fully executed Affidavit of Uncompleted Work, which declares, among other things, the value and estimated completion date of all uncompleted contracts to be completed with Bidder's own forces and to be subcontracted to others. Such affidavit shall be attached to the bid on the form provided.

Q. Bidder's Financial Statement

Each Bidder shall have on file in the office of the Commission at the time of bid opening a financial statement dated not earlier then the end of said Bidder's last fiscal year period. This will be kept on file by the Commission as a representative statement for a period of one year only. If a Bidder does not have such statement on file, it must submit a copy with its bid. Failure to have a current financial statement on file at the Commission at time of bid opening may be cause for the rejection of the Contractor's Bid.

R. Disclosure Affidavit

Each Bidder shall have on file in the office of the Commission at the time of bid opening a fully executed Disclosure Affidavit pursuant to Section 21.13 "Disclosure Affidavit."

S. Affidavit of Local Business

Each Bidder shall have on file in the office of the Commission at the time of bid opening a fully executed Affidavit of Local Business with current documentation as required in Section 21.18 "Local Business Preference."

T. Statement of Bidder's Qualifications

Each Bidder shall have on file in the office of the Commission at the time of bid opening a fully executed Statement of Bidder's Qualifications or a Qualification Submittal in response to a Request for Qualifications (RFQ). The Commission reserves the right to request additional information regarding the capability of the Bidder to perform the Contract.

U. Disclosure of Retained Parties

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The apparent low Bidder and the apparent 2nd low bidder shall submit a fully executed Disclosure of Retained Parties pursuant to the instructions on the document.

V. Submission of Bid

- 1. Two (2) copies of all bid documents with original signatures shall be enclosed in two (2) envelopes each (outer and inner), both of which shall be sealed and clearly labeled with "BID DOCUMENTS," the Contract number, name of Bidder, and date and time of opening.
- 2. Bids received prior to the advertised hour of opening will be securely kept.
- 3. Written modifications of bids will be considered only if received prior to the time stated for receipt of Proposals and provided "BID MODIFICATIONS TO SEALED PROPOSAL" is marked on the lower left-hand corner of the envelope in which the bid modification is enclosed so that the modification will be recognized to prevent its being opened prior to scheduled public opening of bids. Telephonic or oral modifications will not be considered. Bidders are cautioned that modifications which are not explicit and which are in any sense subject to misinterpretation shall make the bid so modified or amended subject to rejection.

W. Withdrawal Of Bids Before Bid Opening

Any Bidder may withdraw its bid by letter, facsimile, telegraphic request, or by personally securing, with proper identification, the submitted bid proposal at any time prior to the time fixed for opening of bids. A telephonic request to withdraw a bid will not be considered.

X. Opening Of Bids

At the time and place fixed for the opening of bids, the Commission will cause to be opened and publicly read aloud every bid received within the time set for receiving bids irrespective of any irregularities therein. Bidders and other persons properly interested may be present in person or by representative.

Y. Evaluation of Bids

- The Commission reserves the right to check all calculations and to correct all extensions in case of
 error in order to determine the correct amount of the Total Base Bid and/or the total amount of any
 other schedule required. Errors in the bid breakdown may result in a non-responsive bid.
- 2. If a discrepancy occurs in an amount written both in words and in figures, the amount written in words will prevail.
- 3. Along with reviewing the calculations of each bid, the Commission will evaluate each Bidder's responsiveness to all Bid requirements and responsibility.

Z. Award Of Contract; Rejection Of Bids

- 1. The Contract will be awarded to the responsible Bidder submitting the lowest Award Criteria, as defined herein, complying with the conditions set forth in the Contract Documents. However, if the local business preference is applicable, the determination of the lowest responsible bidder will be made after a two percent (2%) local business preference is applied to the Award Criteria of all Bidders that do not meet the conditions defined in Section 21.18 "Local Business Preference."
- 2. The Bidder to whom the award is made will be notified at the earliest possible date.
- Upon award of Contract, the Commission will process the Contract for final execution.

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4. The Commission reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive any informality in bids received whenever it determines such rejection or waiver is in its interest.

AA. Performance and Payment Bond and Insurance

- Upon approval by the Commission to award, and within five (5) days after being given notice, the successful Bidder shall execute and deliver to the Commission the Performance and Payment Bond in the form included in the Contract Documents and evidence of the required insurance coverage.
- 2. The Performance and Payment Bond shall be in the form herein and in the full amount of the Base Contract Price and shall be security for the faithful performance of the Contract and payment of all persons, firms, or corporations to whom the Contractor may become legally indebted for labor, material, facilities or services of any nature, employed or used by it in performing the Work. The current power of attorney for the persons who sign for any surety company shall be attached to such bond. Such power of attorney shall be sealed and certified with a "first hand signature" by an officer of the surety. A facsimile signature will not be accepted by the Commission. The Commission reserves the right to approve the surety company.
- 3. The failure of the successful Bidder to supply the required Performance and Payment Bond or evidence of the required insurance coverage within five (5) days of notice, or within such extended period as the Commission may grant based upon reasons determined sufficient by the Commission, shall constitute a default and the Commission may either award the Contract to the next lowest responsible bidder or re-advertise for bids. The difference between the amount of its bid and the amount for which a contract for the work is subsequently executed may be charged against the Bidder, irrespective of whether the amount thus due exceeds the amount of the bid security. If a more favorable bid is received by re-advertising, the defaulting Bidder shall have no claim against the Commission for a refund. Because of the difficulty of ascertaining the damage caused to the Commission, such sum shall be considered liquidated damages and shall not constitute a penalty. The election by the Commission to grant an extension to the period allowed for the bidder to provide an acceptable performance and payment bond and/or evidence of insurance coverage shall not entitle the bidder to an extension of time required to complete the Work.

BB.Order of Precedence of Components of the Contract Documents

- 1. The order of precedence of the components of the Contract Documents shall be as follows:
 - a) Standard Terms and Conditions (Book 1);
 - b) Addenda, if any;
 - c) Drawings;
 - d) Technical Specifications;
 - e) Project Information, Instructions, and Execution Documents (Book 2);
 - f) Advertisement for proposals (copy of advertisement to be attached to back of cover); and
 - g) Performance and Payment Bond, if required.
- 2. The foregoing order of precedence shall govern the interpretation of the Contract in all cases of conflict or inconsistency therein, except as may be otherwise expressly provided by the Commission.

CC. Protests

1. The bidder shall submit any protests or claims regarding this solicitation to the office of the Commission's Executive Director. A pre-bid protest must be filed five (5) days before the bid opening date, a pre-award protest must be filed no later than ten (10) days after the bid opening date, and a post-award protest must be filed no later than ten (10) days after the award of the Contract.

COOK COUNTY

TRUCK DRIVERS (WEST) - That part of the county West of Barrington Road.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial/Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walls, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished

interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS ELECTRICIAN - Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair and service of radio, television, recording, voice sound vision production and reproduction, telephone and telephone interconnect, facsimile, data apparatus, coaxial, fibre optic and wireless equipment, appliances and systems used for the transmission and reception of signals of any nature, business, domestic, commercial, education, entertainment, and residential purposes, including but not limited to, communication and telephone, electronic and sound equipment, fibre optic and data communication systems, and the performance of any task directly related to such installation or service whether at new or existing sites, such tasks to include the placing of wire and cable and electrical power conduit or other raceway work within the equipment room and pulling wire and/or cable through conduit and the installation of any incidental conduit, such that the employees covered hereby can complete any job in full.

MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all mateiral that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up thin set for the installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installatin of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone, granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and experiors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and experior

which sare installed in a similar manner.

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of sand, cement, marble chips, and all other materials that may be used by the Mosaic Terrazzo Mechanic, and the mixing, grinding, grouting, cleaning and sealing of all Marble, Mosaic, and Terrazzo work, floors, base, stairs, and wainscoting by hand or machine, and in addition, assisting and aiding Marble, Masonic, and Terrazzo Mechanics.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

Work associated with barricades, horses and drums used to reduce lane usage on highway work, the installation and removal of temporary lane markings, and the installation and removal of temporary road signs.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION - EAST & WEST

Class 1. Two or three Axle Trucks. A-frame Truck when used for transportation purposes; Air Compressors and Welding Machines, including those pulled by cars, pick-up trucks and tractors; Ambulances; Batch Gate Lockers; Batch Hopperman; Car and Truck Washers; Carry-alls; Fork Lifts and Hoisters; Helpers; Mechanics Helpers and Greasers; Oil Distributors 2-man operation; Pavement Breakers; Pole Trailer, up to 40 feet; Power Mower Tractors; Self-propelled Chip Spreader; Skipman; Slurry Trucks, 2-man operation; Slurry Truck Conveyor Operation, 2 or 3 man; TEamsters Unskilled dumpman; and Truck Drivers hauling warning lights, barricades, and portable toilets on the job site.

Class 2. Four axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors under 7 yards; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnapulls or Turnatrailers when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment under 16 cubic yards; Mixer Trucks under 7 yards; Ready-mix Plant Hopper Operator, and Winch Trucks, 2 Axles.

Class 3. Five axle trucks; Dump Crets and Adgetors 7 yards and over; Dumpsters, Track Trucks, Euclids, Hug Bottom Dump Turnatrailers or turnapulls when pulling other than self-loading equipment or similar equipment over 16 cubic yards; Explosives and/or Fission Material Trucks; Mixer Trucks 7 yards or over; Mobile Cranes while in transit; Oil Distributors, 1-man operation; Pole Trailer, over 40 feet; Pole and Expandable Trailers hauling material over 50 feet long; Slurry trucks, 1-man operation; Winch trucks, 3 axles or more; Mechanic--Truck Welder and Truck Painter.

Class 4. Six axle trucks; Dual-purpose vehicles, such as mounted crane trucks with hoist and accessories; Foreman; Master Mechanic; Self-loading equipment like P.B. and trucks with scoops on the front.

OPERATING ENGINEERS - BUILDING

Class 1. Mechanic; Asphalt Plant; Asphalt Spreader; Autograde; Backhoes with Caisson attachment; Batch Plant; Benoto; Boiler and Throttle Valve; Caisson Rigs; Central Redi-Mix Plant; Combination Back Hoe Front End-loader Machine; Compressor and Throttle Valve; Concrete Breaker (Truck Mounted); Concrete Conveyor; Concrete Paver; Concrete Placer; Concrete Placing Boom; Concrete Pump (Truck Mounted);

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 618/993-7271 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.

SECTION 02316 SOIL MANAGEMENT AND HANDLING

PART 1 - GENERAL

1.1 Introduction

- A. Related Documents: All terms and conditions of the Contract apply to this Section.
- B. Work included: This specification is for the excavation, stockpiling, loading, hauling, removal, and disposal of any soils, fill, backfill, top soil, CU Structural Soil, and general construction and demolition debris which includes soil that exceeds Tier 1 SROs, and for the management and disposal of all storm water and liquid wastes during construction activities. The Contractor shall perform the work under this section in accordance with all applicable local, county, IEPA, USEPA, and OSHA regulations. The Work shall include the following:

1. Removal and disposal

- a. Excavation of soils, fill, backfill, top soil, CU Structural Soil, and general construction and demolition debris materials to the depth required to complete the proposed site preparation/construction work activities as specified in the Architectural/Engineering drawings and specifications, or to the depth indicated in this specification and Remediation Plan, whichever is greater. The excavated materials shall be classified as Clean Construction and Demolition Debris (CCDD) or General Construction and Demolition Debris.
- b. Obtain disposal authorization from a permitted Subtitle D landfill for the disposal of excavated CCDD or General Construction and Demolition Debris. Contractor may dispose of CCDD at a current or former quarry filling site, provided the site has applied to the Illinois EPA for interim authorization or is permitted by other regulatory agencies for sites located outside Illinois. The contractor shall provide a letter from the site indicating acceptance of materials at the facility. The authorization letter must be signed by the filling site representative and state that the facility has reviewed the analytical results provided in this specification and that the facility has agreed to accept the soils for permanent placement on site, and that the material will not be removed from the site.
- Perform all analytical testing for waste stream authorizations as necessary to secure all required disposal permits for all materials.
- d. Load and transport all materials to the approved disposal sites in covered trucks.
- e. Prepare daily reports, transport manifests, weight tickets and receipts (as applicable) prior to starting any soil removal activities.
- f. Provide copies of all daily reports, transport/waste manifest, weight tickets, and disposal receipts (as applicable) to the Owner's Representative on a daily basis documenting proper disposal of soils (including non-special waste soils

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and non-hazardous special waste soils), fill, backfill, top soil, CU Structural Soil, and general construction and demolition debris materials.

2. Placement of backfill materials

- a. Place and compact backfill materials at all excavation areas using approved materials in accordance with the Architectural/Engineering specifications. The backfill materials shall not contain any chemicals that exceed the parameter values as listed in APPENDIX B, SECTION 742, TABLE A; TIERED APPROACH TO CORRECTIVE ACTION OBJECTIVES (TACO): 35 ILL. ADM. CODE 742. The date of the environmental analysis of each type of backfill materials shall be within 30 days of importing such material to the site.
- b. The Contractor shall comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws, regulations and ordinance that govern or regulate the handling, transportation, and disposal of all excavated materials from the site.

1.2 Definitions

- A. Agency means Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA).
- B. Backfill means granular or cohesive material used to fill the excavation to design grade as referenced in design plans and specifications, and which does not exceed the parameter values as listed in Title 35: Environmental Protection Subtitle G: Waste Disposal Chapter I: Pollution Control Board Subchapter F: Risk Based Cleanup Objectives, Part 742, Tiered Approach To Corrective Action Objectives, Appendix B.
- C. CU Structural Soil means a uniformly blended mixture of crushed stone, clay, loam and hydrogel as referenced in Specification 02901.
- D. Clean Construction and Demolition Debris means uncontaminated concrete without protruding rebar, brick, rock, stone, reclaimed asphalt pavement, and uncontaminated soil materials. Based on the Illinois EPA, a material is contaminated if:
 - i. Elements or compounds not naturally found in the material are present;
 - ii. Elements or compounds naturally occurring in the material are at concentrations above the normal range of values; or
 - iii. Waste or landscape waste is found in the material.
- E. Clean Construction and Demolition Debris (CCDD) filling site means any former or current quarry that has applied to the Illinois EPA for interim authorization and are operating in accordance with Section 22.51 of the Environmental Protection Act. For disposal sites outside of Illinois, the facility must be permitted by applicable state and local regulatory agencies.
- F. General Construction and Demolition (C&D) Debris means non-hazardous, uncontaminated materials resulting from construction, remodeling, repair, and demolition of utilities, structures, and roads as defined in Public Act 92-0574, The Environmental Protection Act, 415 ILCS 5 Section 3.160 and regulated under Title 35: Environmental

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Protection; Subtitle G: Waste Disposal; Chapter I: Pollution Control Board; Subchapter i: Solid Waste and Special Waste Hauling. General Construction and demolition (C&D) debris may include soil, wall coverings, reclaimed asphalt pavement, rock, plaster, glass, non-hazardous painted wood, drywall, plastics, non-hazardous coated wood, non-asbestos insulation, bricks, wood products, roofing shingles, concrete, and general roof coverings. General construction and demolition debris shall be disposed of at a licensed landfill.

- G. Environmental Consultant means the entity with overall responsibility for the direction and control of the environmental investigations, assessments, designs, and supervision of remediation work.
- H. Fill means any earthen or non-earthen materials including but not limited to any sediment, granular or cohesive non-native earthen materials, cinders, ash, wood, and brick, concrete, and asphalt fragments, glass, and building debris encountered above naturally occurring undisturbed soils or bedrock in built-up areas.
- I. Hazardous Waste means a waste, or combination of wastes, which has been identified by characteristics or listing as hazardous pursuant to Section 3001 of the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act of 1976, P.L. 94-580, 40 CFR part 261, Illinois Environmental protection Act 415 ILCS 5/3.220, and Section 809.103 of Title 35: Environmental Protection; Subtitle G: Waste Disposal; Chapter I: Pollution Control Board. A waste is classified as hazardous if it exhibits any of the following characteristics: 1) ignitability, 2) corrosivity, 3) reactivity, or 4) toxicity, and as defined in Illinois Administrative Code Title 35, Section 721.103 (35 IAC 721.103).
- J. IEPA means Illinois Environmental Protection Agency.
- K. IDOT means Illinois Department of Transportation.
- L. Landscape waste means all accumulations of grass or shrubbery cuttings, leaves, tree limbs and other materials accumulated as the result of the care of lawns, shrubbery, vines and trees.
- M. Landfill means a facility permitted by the Illinois EPA, or other State Agency for sites outside Illinois, for the disposal of household waste and other type of Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) wastes such as commercial solid waste, non-hazardous sludge, small quantity generator waste, and industrial solid waste on land meeting the requirements of the RCRA Subtitle D.
- N. Manifest means the form provided or prescribed by IEPA and used for identifying name, quality, routing, and destination of special waste during its transportation from point of generation to the point of disposal, treatment, or storage.
- O. MSDS means Material Safety Data Sheet, required by OSHA for any substances that are toxic, caustic, or otherwise potentially hazardous to workers.
- P. OSHA means Occupational Safety and Health Administration.
- Q. Owner's Representative (OR) means the person or entity designated as the official representative of the owner in connection with a project.

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- R. Remediation Area means any area on site where underground storage tanks, non-special waste and/or non-hazardous special waste, or soil that do not meet Tier 1 SROs for residential properties is present.
- Soil means any granular or cohesive materials designated for removal as specified in the Architect/Engineer drawings and specifications and includes soils that are determined to be non-special and special waste.
- T. Special Waste means any wastes as defined in Title 35: Environmental Protection; Subtitle G: Waste Disposal; Chapter I: Pollution Control Board; Subchapter i: Solid Waste and Special Waste Hauling; Part 808: Special Waste Classifications; Subpart A: General Provisions; Section 808.110,

AND

Any wastes as defined in Title 35: Environmental Protection; Subtitle G: Waste Disposal; Chapter I: Pollution Control Board; Subchapter i: Solid Waste and Special Waste Hauling; Part 809: Non Hazardous Special Waste Classifications; Subpart A: General Provisions; Section 809.103. No special waste is present at the site based on the results of the site investigation.

- U. SROs means Soil Remediation Objectives for various exposure routes identified in 35 Illinois Administrative Code 742: Tiered Approach To Corrective Action Objectives (TACO).
- V. Storm water means water deposited at the site in the form of rain, snow or other natural weather event.
- W. TACO means TIERED APPROACH TO CORRECTIVE ACTION OBJECTIVES (TACO) per 35 Illinois Administrative Code 742.
- X. Top Soil means soils placed to design grade and used to promote vegetative growth, and which does not exceed those parameter values as listed in Title 35: Environmental Protection Subtitle G: Waste Disposal Chapter I: Pollution Control Board Subchapter F: Risk Based Cleanup Objectives, Part 742, Tiered Approach To Corrective Action Objectives, Appendix B.
- Y. USEPA means United States Environmental Protection Agency.

1.3 SITE INFORMATION

A Limited Soil Investigation was conducted at the site. The limited site investigation consisted of a review of historical Sanborn maps and City of Chicago Department of Environment records; a site reconnaissance; a metallic survey; and limited subsurface site investigation. The following is a summary of the site environmental investigation findings:

The site appears to have been used for residential use and subsequently as part of Columbus Public School. The metallic survey did not indicate the presence of any underground metallic anomaly at the site.

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GSG performed the limited site investigation activities on March 27 and May 17, 2006. GSG collected a total of eleven (11) soil samples from the Site for soil screening purposes. No PID readings, odors or staining were observed or recorded during the site investigation. Soil samples were analyzed for Polynuclear Aromatic Compounds (PNAs), and Total Lead and Arsenic, which are typically encountered in fill soil in the City of Chicago.

GSG compared the analytical results to the Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) Tiered Approach to Corrective Action Objectives (TACO), Tier 1 Remediation Objectives for Residential Use for the contaminants present at the Site. Arsenic values were below the Tier 1 SROs for the Residential Use. PNA constituents and Lead exceeded the Tier 1 SROs for the Residential property ingestion exposure route in several for the Residential property use. However, the PNA concentrations of three (3) of the eleven (11) samples (SB3, SB4, B2-1) were also above PNA background levels for the Chicagoland area. The horizontal and vertical extent of soil containing PNAs above the Chicago metropolitan area background concentration is unknown at this time.

Exhibit 1 shows the location of all soil borings completed at the site. Appendix A, attached, provides a copy of the analytical results of the soil borings. The contractor shall be responsible for reviewing all reports provided and understanding all data associated with these reports.

1.4 Submittals

- A. Copies of the following submittals shall be prepared and submitted to the Owner's Representative at Contractor's own cost:
 - 1. Soil, Fill, Backfill, CU Structural Soil, Construction and Demolition Debris Removal
 - a. Contractor's Site Specific Health and Safety Plan for all workers engaged in excavation, stockpiling, loading, hauling, removal, and disposal of any soils (including non-special waste soils and non-hazardous special waste soils), fill, general construction and demolition debris from the property. The plan shall comply with all OSHA requirements. The work shall be performed under the direct supervision of a trained experienced site supervisor. The plan should at a minimum include the following:
 - 1) Name key personnel and alternates responsible for site safety.
 - 2) Describe the risks associated with each operation conducted.
 - Type of personnel training and responsibilities and to handle the specific hazardous situations they may encounter.
 - 4) Describe the protective clothing and equipment to be worn by personnel during various site operations.
 - 5) Describe any site-specific medical surveillance requirements.
 - 6) Describe the program for the periodic air monitoring, personnel monitoring, and environmental sampling if needed.
 - 7) Describe the actions to be taken to mitigate existing hazards to make the work environment less hazardous.
 - 8) Define site control measures including a site map.

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- 9) Establish procedures for personnel and equipment and transporting trucks to ensure that impacted soils are not tracked off site on to nonimpacted areas of the site.
- 10) Set forth the site Standard Operating Procedures (SOPs). SOPs are those activities that can be standardized (i.e., decon procedures and respirator fit testing).
- 11) Set forth a Contingency Plan for the safe and effective response to emergencies.
- b. Soil Management Plan outlining proposed excavation work sequences and procedures to separate each type of material to be removed from the site from clean materials. The Soil Management Plan shall show the locations of each type of material to be stored on site, location of clean materials to be stored at the site for reuse, and location of material to be stored on site for future disposal. The Plan shall also include information regarding concrete and brick recycling procedures and name and address of the concrete and brick recycling sites that will be used as part of this project.
- c. Name, address and telephone number of the permitted landfill where excavated materials (including non-special waste soils and non-hazardous special waste soils), fill, general construction and demolition debris are to be transported. This submittal must be made prior to removal of any materials from the site. This information should include, at a minimum, the following:
 - Facility Name and Address and Telephone Number.
 - 2) Site Contact.
 - Facility Identification Number issued by Illinois, U.S. EPA, or other state licensing agencies for site outside Illinois

If a CCDD filling site is to be used, the contractor shall provide evidence that the site has applied for an interim authorization with the Illinois EPA.

- d. Letter of authorization from the landfill and CCDD filling site where excavated materials are to be disposed of. The authorization must be signed by the landfill/CCDD filling site representative and state that the facility complies with all local zoning codes and all local, State, and Federal rules and regulations, that all required laboratory analyses has been received by the facility, and that the facility has agreed to accept the soils (including non-special waste soils, and non-hazardous special waste soils), fill, and general construction and demolition debris materials. The Authorization shall further state that the soils (including non-special waste soils and non-hazardous special waste soils), fill, general construction and demolition debris fill materials are being accepted for permanent placement on site, and that the material will not be removed from the site unless required by a local, State or Federal Authority.
- e. Copies of analytical results for each waste stream to be removed from the site as applicable. The name and address and telephone number of the laboratory that will be used by the Contractor to perform analytical testing for waste stream authorization.

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- f. Storm Water Management Plan prior to commencing work, the contractor shall provide a Storm Water Management Plan stipulating provisions for dewatering, pumping, collection, temporary storage, and discharge or disposal of storm water, perched water and other liquids, contaminated and/or uncontaminated, at the site so as to facilitate soil removal and minimize disposal costs for contaminated fluids.
- g. Copies of all daily reports, transport/waste manifests, weight tickets and receipts (as applicable) to the Owner's Representative and/or Project Manager on a daily basis.
- h. Any sampling data collected during the course of the Work.
- i. Prior to importing any backfill to the site, provide copies of analytical results of for each source of backfill materials verifying that the backfill does not exceed the values listed in PART 742, PPENDIX B, TABLE A; TIERED APPROACH TO CORRECTIVE ACTION OBJECTIVES (TACO): 35 ILL. ADM. CODE 742. The date of the backfill analytical results should be within 30 days of importing such material to the site. This shall include all topsoil, cohesive, granular, and other fills. The Contractor shall collect sufficient number of conformation soil samples throughout the backfilling activities to verify that all imported soils do not exceed the TACO values.
 - j. Name and address and telephone number of the IEPA-approved laboratory that will be used by the Contractor to perform analytical testing for waste stream authorization and backfill samples prior to starting work.

1.5 Submittal Review

A. Review of submittals or any comments made does not relieve the Contractor from compliance with the requirements of the drawings and specifications. The purpose of this check is to review for general conformance with the design concept of the project and general compliance with the information given in the contract documents. The Contractor is responsible for confirming and correlating all quantities and dimensions; electing techniques of construction; coordinating the Work; and performing the Work in a safe and satisfactory manner.

1.6 Notifications

A. The Contractor shall notify the OR and Environmental Consultant no less than forty-eight (48) business hours prior to loading and transporting any materials from the site.

1.7 Recordkeeping

A. The Contractor shall provide documentation of labor, equipment, materials and disposal laboratory analysis used for soil removal, when requested by the OR and Environmental Consultant.

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PART 2 - PRODUCTS

- 2.1 Removal of Soil, Fill, Backfill, CU Structural Soil, and Construction and Demolition Debris
 - A. The Contractor shall furnish all necessary means, products, tools, and equipment required to remove soil (including non-special waste soils and non-hazardous special waste soils), fill, backfill, CU Structural Soil and construction and demolition debris from the site as directed by the OR.

PART 3 - EXECUTION

3.1 Authorizations

- A. Obtain authorization from landfill where soils (including non-special waste soils and non-hazardous special waste soils), fill, backfill, CU Structural Soil and construction and demolition debris are to be deposited. The Authorization must be signed by the property owner and shall state that the property owner has received a copy of one or more laboratory analyses of representative sample(s) collected from the site by the contractor and has agreed to accept the material. The Authorization shall further state that the site owner agrees to accept the material for permanent placement on their site and that the material will not be removed from their site unless required by a local, State or Federal Authority. The Authorization further shall state that the site complies with all local zoning codes, State, Federal and Local laws, rules, and regulations.
- B. Obtain prior authorization from OR and Environmental Consultant to backfill excavations and utility lines, and apply top soil. All backfill, CU Structural Soil, and top soil shall comply with site specific project specifications.
- C. Haulers for transportation of soils, backfill and top soil shall hold, and present upon request, a current valid Commercial Driver's License (CDL).

3.2 Material Sampling

- A. Soil, Fill, Backfill, CU Structural Soil, Construction and Demolition debris
 - 1. The Contractor shall collect sufficient amount of representative sample(s) from each type of material being removed from the site for analytical testing to obtain authorization for the ultimate disposition of the materials. The contractor is responsible for acquisition of any required permits and payment of all fees.
 - 2. The Contractor shall be responsible for obtaining liquid samples as needed for characterization for liquid disposal offsite or disposition onsite as applicable. The Contractor is responsible to the acquisition of any required disposal permits and the payment of any fees associated with liquid disposal.
 - 3. The Contractor shall submit the soil and liquid samples (as applicable) to the laboratory and pay for the cost of analyzing the constituents required for the ultimate disposition of soils and liquids.

- 4. The Environmental Consultant may collect samples for laboratory analysis or field Photo-ionization Detector (PID) screening, or liquid samples for laboratory analysis. The Contractor shall provide the necessary equipment and manpower to assist the Environmental Consultant to collect materials to be sampled at no additional cost to the project.
- 5. The Contractor shall immediately notify the OR and the Environmental Consultant if any materials, (solid or liquid) requiring special handling (i.e., stained soil, soil with odors, or liquids) are encountered.
- 6. All excavated soils, liquids, and other material shall be removed from the site in accordance with applicable federal, state and local regulations.

3.3 Excavation

- A. The Contractor shall perform excavation of soils (including non-special waste soils and non-hazardous special waste soils), fill, backfill, CU Structural Soil and construction and demolition debris as directed by the OR and Environmental Consultant.
- B. The Contractor shall perform excavation of materials in accordance with all applicable regulations and project specifications. All excavation shall be performed in accordance with OSHA requirements and guidelines.
- C. The Contractor shall coordinate all soil excavation and hauling from the site activities with the OR and Environmental Consultant. The Contractor must provide a written notification to the OR and the Environmental Consultant at least 48-hour prior to starting any soil excavation or hauling from the site.
- D. In the proposed concrete sidewalks, playground surfaces, and pavement, excavate soil to the depth required for construction purposes. Refer to Architectural/Engineering drawings and specifications for details regarding proposed construction and finished ground elevations.
- E. In the proposed landscape areas, excavate soil to the depth of 2 feet below existing grade. Refer to Architectural/Engineering drawings and specifications for details regarding proposed construction and finished ground elevations. Refer to the Soil Management and Handling Plan for depth of soil removal.
- F. All excavated materials from the site; including footings and underground utilities; will be classified as General Construction and Demolition Debris, or Clean Construction and Demolition Debris. No soils removed from the site may be recycled. All soils removed form the site shall be transported to a permitted landfill. Materials that are classified as CCDD may dispose of at state approved CCDD filling site. The Soil Management Plan drawing shows the location and depth of each type of materials present at the site. The extent and depths of the materials are approximate and based on the available site investigation data.
- G. The Contractor shall be responsible for maintaining the structural integrity of all surrounding streets, underground utilities, buildings, and structures (walkways, sidewalks, underground tunnels, etc.).

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H. All backfill materials shall not exceed the values listed in PART 742, APPENDIX B, TABLE A; TIERED APPROCH TO CORRECTIVE ACTION OBJECTIVES (TACO); 35 ILL. ADM. CODE 742.

3.4 Hauling

- A. All excavated materials shall be hauled off-site using only covered trucks.
- B. The Contractor shall remove soils, dusts, rocks, etc. from the exterior of trucks, trailers, or other heavy equipment leaving the site before they leave the site.
- C. The Contractor shall clean the tractor-trailers or trucks that are loaded with materials for off site placement/salvage by removing clinging soils, or rocks from the exterior of the equipment.
- D. The Contractor shall not create dust and shall maintain adequate dust suppression equipment on site if conditions warrant.
- E. The Contractor shall maintain streets clean and free of mud and dirt.
- F. The Contractor shall conduct soil, fill, backfill, CU Structural Soil and construction and demolition debris removal in a manner that ensures minimum interference with roads; streets, walks and other adjacent occupied and used facilities. Do not close or obstruct streets, walks or other occupied or used facilities without permission from the applicable governing agency and the OR. Provide alternate routes around closed or obstructed traffic ways if required by the governing agency.

3.5 Transportation

- A. The Contractor shall cover all trucks prior to leaving the site
- B. The Contractor shall remove soils, dusts, rocks, etc. from the exterior of trucks, trailers, or other heavy equipment leaving the site before they leave the site. The Contractor shall provide and complete copies of all daily reports, weight tickets and receipts (as applicable) for transportation and ultimate off site placement of materials removed from the property to the OR, review and signature as required.

3.6 Dust Control

A. The Contractor shall control dust by all necessary means, including but not limited to covering trucks, stockpiles and open materials, watering haul roads, sweeping paved roads, and limiting the speed of all on-site vehicles.

3.7 Storm Water Management

- A. The Contractor shall subscribe to a weather notification system and manage the work so as not to accumulate storm water on the site during excavation.
- B. Prior to commencing work, the contractor shall provide a storm water management plan. This plan shall stipulate provisions for dewatering, pumping, collection, temporary storage, and discharge or disposal of storm water, perched water and other liquids, contaminated and/or uncontaminated, at the site so as to facilitate soil removal and minimize disposal costs for contaminated fluids.
- C. The Contractor shall ensure that contamination of water, perched water and previously uncontaminated water or perched water does not occur by preventing the contact of such liquid with materials that exceed the parameter values as listed in Title 35: Environmental Protection Subtitle G: Waste Disposal Chapter I: Pollution Control Board Subchapter F: Risk Based Cleanup Objectives, Part 742, Tiered Approach To Corrective Action Objectives, Appendix B, Table A. Earthen berms, plastic (polyethylene) sheeting, pumping, and other such means, as specified in the approved Storm water Management Plan, may be used.
- D. If the Contractor, through negligence, allows storm water to contact materials that exceed the parameter values as listed in Title 35: Environmental Protection Subtitle G: Waste Disposal Chapter I: Pollution Control Board Subchapter F: Risk Based Cleanup Objectives, Part 742, Tiered Approach To Corrective Action Objectives, Appendix B, Table A, the water must be disposed of as water that exceeds the parameter values as listed in Title 35: Environmental Protection Subtitle G: Waste Disposal Chapter I: Pollution Control Board Subchapter F: Risk Based Cleanup Objectives, Part 742, Tiered Approach To Corrective Action Objectives, Appendix B, Table A. The Contractor will be responsible for the additional costs incurred for any disposal analysis and disposal costs.

3.10 Quality Control

- A. Visual inspections and damage repairs shall be made daily by the Contractor and/or as directed by the OR to assure that erosion, drainage and containment control measures are functioning properly.
- B. The Contractor shall take all necessary precautions to protect structures, equipment, pavement, walks and utilities against movement or settlement during the course of work.
- C. Damages: Promptly replace or repair any damage caused to adjacent pavement, utilities or facilities by removal operations at no additional cost. Work shall be performed to the satisfaction of the OR.
- D. Utility Services: Maintain existing utilities and protect against damage during removal operations.


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



(A) UNDERGROUND UTILITIES REMEDIATION PLAN SCALE: NTS



GSG Consultants, Inc. (GSG) has completed a limited subsurface investigation and geotechnical analysis at the above referenced project. GSG understands that the proposed Campus Park project includes new landscape designs, installation of underground utilities, and a new parking lot. The purpose of the site investigation was to characterize the subsurface soil conditions, and to determine the stability of fill materials to support the proposed site improvement. The limited subsurface investigation included advancing a total of five (5) soil borings to a depth of 10 feet each.

Subsurface Investigation

The subsurface soil investigation was conducted on March 27, 2006, and included the performance of five (5) soil borings to a depth of 10 feet each. The locations of the soil borings were selected based on the historic review of the site's uses and the proposed site development, which was provided by the Public Building Commission of Chicago. The soil borings were drilled using a D-120 truck-mounted drill rig using 3½-inch I.D. hollow-stem augers to advance the borehole, except soil boring B-5, which was completed using direct push geoprobe equipment. GSG performed the field exploration activities using standard penetration test procedures in accordance with the ASTM D1586-99, "Penetration Test and Split-barrel Sampling of Soil." Water level measurements were also made in each boring when evidence of free groundwater was detected on the drill rods or in the sample. The borehole was also checked for free water immediately after auger removal and before filling the open boreholes with soil cuttings. The site is relatively flat, and no surface elevations were measured during the field survey activities. Exhibit 1, Soil Boring Location Plan, shows the location of the soil borings completed at the site.

Representative soil samples were obtained from each borings using the standard penetration test procedures. In this procedure, a 2 inch O.D. split-spoon sampler is driven 18 inches into undisturbed soil using a 30 inch drop of a 140 pound hammer. Blow counts were recorded at 6 inches intervals for each sample collected during the field activities. The number of blows

needed to advance the sampler 12 inches is called the standard penetration test (SPT) values. The SPT values are shown on the boring logs. Blow counts were not recorded for soil boring B-5 since the vicinity of the boring was inaccessible for the drill rig, and GSG utilized a direct push geoprobe equipment to collect soil samples. GSG's field representative visually classified the soils according to the Unified Soil Classification System (ASTM 2487), performed pocket penetrometer tests on all cohesive soil samples to estimate their unconfined compressive strength, and obtained relatively undisturbed and bulk samples of the subsurface soil for laboratory testing. The results of the pocket penetrometer test are shown on the boring logs. Soil samples obtained from the borings were placed in 4 inch geotechnical glass jars to reduce moisture loss and disturbance. Soil boring holes were back-filled with soil cuttings and bentonite pellets, and were patched with cold asphalt, when needed, after the borings were completed.

The Site's subsurface soil profile consists of the following stratigraphic units: Asphlat at an average thickness of 3 inches, followed by fill materials consisting of dark brick fragment, sand, gravel, and clay. The fill materials extend to an average depth of 2.5 feet below existing surface. Directly below the fill materials, medium stiff to very stiff clay was encountered in all soil borings. No free water was present in the borehole after completing the soil borings. Appendix A, Soil Boring Logs, provide specific soil conditions encountered at each soil boring location. The soil boring logs include soil descriptions, stratifications, penetration resistance, location of the samples, and laboratory test data. The stratification shown on the boring logs represents the conditions only at the actual borings locations. The stratification represents the approximate boundary between subsurface materials; however, the actual transition may be gradual. Detailed descriptions of the subsurface soil profile are provided in the soil boring logs.

Laboratory Testing

The purpose of the laboratory testing program was to classify and evaluate physical properties of the soils which may affect the geotechnical aspects of project design and construction. The laboratory testing included performing the following:

Moisture content: Moisture content was performed on all cohesive soil samples collected from the site. Tests were performed in accordance with ASTM Test Method D2216.

Unconfined Compression: A calibrated pocket penetrometer was used to measure the unconfined compressive strength of the cohesive soil samples collected from the site.

The results of the laboratory tests and soil classification and field observations are included in the soil boring logs

Foundation Analysis and Recommendation

Based on the results of the subsurface investigation, medium stiff to very stiff silty clay is present beneath the fill materials throughout the site. GSG understands that the site development includes new landscape and parking lot. The site preparation work shall include the removal of

all existing asphalt, vegetation, top soil, root mats, uncontrolled fill and any soft or unsuitable/deleterious materials to a depth of 12" below finished grade. The exposed subgrade should be then proof-rolled using a loaded tandem axle dump truck or similar rubber tire vehicle weighing at least 10 tons. The purpose of the proof-roll is to detect the presence of unsuitable or unstable soil that may exist within a few inches of the subgrade level.

For landscape areas, soils which are observed to rut or deflect excessively under the moving load should be wither densified using vibratory drum equipment to a minimum of 85% of the material modified proctor test (ASTM 1557), or undercut, and replaced with granular backfill. The backfill should be placed in 12" thickness loose lifts and compacted using vibratory drum equipment to a minimum of 85% of the material modified maximum dry density (Modified Proctor - ASTM D-1557). Excavated suitable fill materials could be re-used as backfill at landscape areas if it meets the environmental requirements of the project. Please refer to the Limited Site investigation regarding the location and depth of soils that meet the environmental requirement of the project.

The asphalt parking lot and concrete sidewalk areas should be supported upon a minimum of 8 inches of compacted granular fill. The granular fill may consist of crushed stone, clean sand, or gravel base course such as (Illinois DOT CA-6). Prior to the placement of the granular fill, the subgrade should be properly densified/compacted and/or proof-rolled. Soils which are observed to rut or deflect excessively under the moving load should be undercut to a minimum 12 inches and replaced with compacted granular fill. The subgrade should be free of standing water, mud, and frozen soil prior to the placement of base course granular material. The parking lot asphalt should be designed using the Illinois Department of Transportation's pavement design procedures. An assumed CBR/IBR value of 3 could be used for the pavement design. The pavement section should consist of 1 1/2 inches of surface course and 2 inches of binder course over at least 8 inches of granular base course consistent with Illinois DOT CA-6 gradation. The base course should be compacted to at least 95% of the maximum dry density obtained in accordance with ASTM specification D 1557 Modified Proctor Method. The Binder and Surface asphalt layer should be compacted to a minimum of 93% of the theoretical density value. Surface and subsurface drainage of the pavement section should be provided to prevent standing water from developing on the pavement or within the base course since standing water will cause softening of the subgrade and deterioration of the pavement.

Excavation

Underground utilities excavations should be performed in accordance with all applicable local, state and federal laws and regulations. Excavation near existing structures and underground utilities should be performed with extreme care to avoid undermining existing structures. Excavations should not extend below the level of adjacent existing foundations unless underpinning or other support is installed. The sides of the underground utilities excavation should be protected by trench box, or should be sloped until a stable position is attained. The slope should be no less than (1) vertical: (1) horizontal. If the excavation will extend next to existing buildings or streets, it may be necessary to install sheeting and bracing to maintain a

vertical excavation slope. Surcharge loads from the excavated materials, construction equipment and trucks should be included for the design of the excavation system.

Drainage and Groundwater Control

No groundwater was encountered during the site investigation activities. If rainwater run-off or perched water is accumulated at the base of excavation, the contractor should remove accumulated water using conventional sump pits and pump procedures to maintain a dry and stable excavation. The location of the sump should be determined by the contractor based on field conditions. During earthmoving activities at the site, grading should be performed to ensure that drainage is maintained throughout the construction period. Water should not be allowed to accumulate in the foundation area either during or after construction. Undercut and excavated areas should be sloped toward one corner to facilitate removal of any collected rainwater or surface run-off. Grades should be sloped away from the underground utilities excavation to minimize runoff from entering the excavation areas. In general, we do not anticipate groundwater seepage or groundwater problems during site construction activities.

Limitations

GSG has prepared this report in accordance with generally accepted geotechnical engineering practices to aid in the evaluation of the site subsurface soils. No other warranty expressed or implied is made. The scope of this report is limited to the specific project and location described herein, and our description of this project represents our understanding of the project. The geotechnical engineering analysis and foundation recommendations presented herein were developed based on the information obtained during the subsurface investigation. It should be noted that the borehole data reflects the subsurface conditions only at the specific locations at the particular time designated on the borehole logs, and that soil and groundwater conditions could vary widely throughout the site. The nature and extent of any variation in the borehole may not become evident until subsurface exposure, during construction activities. If variations do appear, it may become necessary to re-evaluate the recommendations of this report. 
