It is also understood and agreed that **Time Is Of The Essence In Closing Out The Job Site Work Of This Contract**, and the Contractor agrees to begin work immediately after receipt of a formal comprehensive list of minor miscellaneous or finishing work also known as "Punch List" work.

Failure of the Contractor or his subcontractors to begin the "Punch List" work on the job site prior to the expiration of three (3) calendar days (Grace Period) after receipt of the "Punch List" will be construed as failure to prosecute the Work of the Contract.

It is further understood and agreed that the "Punch List" work must be continuously prosecuted once begun and completed within thirty (30) calendar days from the receipt of the formal "Punch List" from the PBC. Therefore, any gap of more than three (3) calendar days (Grace Period) during which "Punch List" work is not being performed on the job site will also be construed as failure to prosecute the work of the contract.

The failure to commence or continue the "Punch List" work will result in the charging of calendar days, which ever is applicable, for each day beyond the three (3) calendar days (Grace period) aforementioned.

The PBC will be sole judge as to whether days will be charged. If days are charged they will be added to the previously determined number of days at the time of substantial completion/ beneficial occupancy of the contract.

C. Time of Completion of Punch List Work

All final Punch List work must be prosecuted expeditiously and completed, in total, within thirty (30) Days of the date of transmittal to the Contractor.

D. Copies of Drawings and Specifications Furnished

The Commission will furnish to the Contractor one (1) copy of Drawings and Specifications for the execution of the Work. The Contractor is responsible for obtaining additional copies at its own cost.

E. Liquidated Damages

- The Contractor and the Commission understand and mutually agree that the date to begin the Work, the time of completion of the Work, Contract Completion Date, and the time of completion of Punch List Work, all as specified in the Contract, hereunder are essential conditions of this Contract. It is further mutually understood and agreed that the Work embraced in this Contract must be commenced on a date to be specified in the Notice to Proceed.
- 2. The Contractor agrees that said Work must be executed regularly, diligently, and uninterruptedly at such rate of progress as will ensure full completion thereof within the time specified. The Contractor and the Commission understand and agree that the time for the completion of the Work described herein is reasonable time. If the Contractor neglect, fail or refuse to complete the Work within the time herein specified, or any proper extension thereof granted by the Commission, then the Contractor and its surety do hereby agree to pay to the Commission the amount of

not as a penalty but as liquidated damages for such breach of contract as herein set forth for each and every Day that the Contractor shall be in default after time stipulated in the Contract for completing the Work and/or the Punch List Work.

- 3. The Commission may recover said liquidated damages by deducting the amount thereof out of any monies due or that may become due the Contractor. Liquidated damages, if any, will be calculated on completion of the Work and submission of the Contractor's final pay request. The amount of liquidated damages due to the Commission under this provision will bear compound interest at the rate of 5% per annum, compounded monthly from the date of the Notice to Proceed to the date of approval of a deductive change order for liquidated damages. Should the total amount of liquidated damages due under all provisions of this Contract exceed the amount of the Commission's retainage, compound interest on the amount over and above the retainage will continue to accrue until the entire amount of liquidated damages and compound interest is paid to the Commission.
- 4. Completion of the Work, for the purposes of this section only, shall occur upon Substantial Completion of all of the Work required by the Contract Documents. Completion of Punch List Work, for the purposes of this section only, shall occur upon the Architect's acceptance of Punch List Work.

F. Insurance Requirements

The Contractor must provide and maintain at Contractor's own expense, until Contract completion and during the time period following final completion if Contractor is required to return and perform any additional work, the minimum insurance requirements specified below, insuring all operations related to the Contract.

Insurance To Be Provided By the Contractor

1. Workers' Compensation and Employers Liability

Workers' Compensation Insurance, as prescribed by applicable law covering all employees who are to provide a service under the Contract and Employers Liability coverage with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 each accident or illness.

2. Commercial General Liability (Primary and Umbrella)

Commercial General Liability Insurance or equivalent with limits of not less than \$5,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury, personal injury, and property damage liability. Coverage must include the following: All premises and operations, products/completed operations, explosion collapse underground, separation of insureds, defense, and contractual liability (with no limitation endorsement). The Commission and the City of Chicago must be named as additional insureds on a primary, non-contributory basis for any liability arising directly or indirectly from the work.

Subcontractors performing work for Contractor must maintain limits of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence with the same terms herein

3. Automobile Liability (Primary and Umbrella)

When any motor vehicles (owned, non-owned and hired) are used in connection with work to be performed, the Contractor must provide Automobile Liability Insurance, with limits of not less than \$2,000,000 per occurrence for bodily injury and property damage. The Commission and the City of Chicago must be named as additional insureds on a primary, non-contributory basis.

Subcontractors performing work for Contractor must maintain limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence with the same terms herein

4. Professional Liability

When any professional consultant performs work in connection with the Contract, Professional Liability Insurance will be maintained with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 covering acts, errors, or omissions. Coverage must include contractual liability. When policies are renewed or replaced, the policy retroactive date must coincide with, or precede the, start of work on the Contract. A claims-made policy, which is not renewed or replaced, must have an extended reporting period of 2 years.

5. Asbestos Abatement Liability

When any asbestos work is performed in connection with this Contract, Asbestos Abatement Liability Insurance must be provided with limits of not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence insuring bodily injury, property damage and environmental cleanup. When policies are renewed or replaced, the policy retroactive date must coincide with or precede, start of work on the Contract. A claims-made policy, which is not renewed or replaced, must have an extended reporting period of one

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(1) year. The PBC and the City of Chicago are to be named as additional insureds on a primary, non-contributory basis.

6. Property

The Contractor is responsible for all loss or damage to Commission and/or City property at full replacement cost. The Contractor is responsible for all loss or damage to personal property (including but not limited to materials, equipment, tools, and supplies) owned, rented, or used by Contractor.

7. Contractors Pollution Liability

When any work is performed which may cause a pollution exposure, Contractors Pollution Liability must be provided covering bodily injury, property damage and other losses caused by pollution conditions that arise from the Contract scope of services with limits of not less than \$1,000.000 per occurrence. Coverage must include completed operations, contractual liability, defense, environmental cleanup, remediation and disposal. When policies are renewed or replaced, the policy retroactive date must coincide with or precede, start of work on the Contract. A claims-made policy, which is not renewed or replaced, must have an extended reporting period of two (2) years. The Public Building Commission and the City of Chicago are to be named as additional insureds.

8. Owner's and Contractor's Protective Liability

With respect to the operations performed by Contractor, an Owner's and Contractor's Protective Liability policy designating the PBC and the City of Chicago as named insured must be provided with limits of not less than \$1,000,000_ per occurrence, combined single limit, for losses arising out of bodily injuries to or death of all persons and for damage to or destruction of property.

9. Builders Risk

When Contractor undertakes any construction, including improvements, betterments, and/or repairs, the Contractor must provide All Risk Builders Risk Insurance at replacement cost for materials, supplies, equipment, machinery and fixtures that are or will be part of the permanent project. Coverages must include but are not limited to the following: collapse, right to partial occupancy, testing, water including overflow, leakage, sewer backup, or seepage, debris removal, and faulty workmanship or materials, mechanical breakdown or failure and extra expense. The Public Building Commission and City of Chicago are to be named as additional insureds and loss payees.

10. Additional Requirements

The Contractor must furnish the Public Building Commission Procurement Department, Richard J. Daley Center, Room 200, Chicago, IL 60602, original Certificates of Insurance, or such similar evidence, to be in force on the date of this Contract, and Renewal Certificates of Insurance, or such similar evidence, if the coverages have an expiration or renewal date occurring during the term of this Contract. The Contractor must submit evidence of insurance to the Commission before award of Contract. The receipt of any certificate does not constitute agreement by the Commission that the insurance requirements in the Contract have been fully met or that the insurance policies indicated on the certificate are in compliance with all Contract requirements. The failure of the Commission to obtain certificates or other insurance evidence from Contractor is not a waiver by the Commission of any requirements for the Contractor to obtain and maintain the specified coverages. The Contractor

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will advise all insurers of the Contract provisions regarding insurance. Non-conforming insurance does not relieve Contractor of the obligation to provide insurance as specified in this Contract. Nonfulfillment of the insurance conditions may constitute a violation of the Contract, and the Commission retains the right to stop work until proper evidence of insurance is provided, or the Contract may be terminated.

The Commission reserves the right to obtain copies of insurance policies and records from the Contractor and/or its subcontractors at any time upon written request.

The insurance must provide for 60 days prior written notice to be given to the Commission if coverage is substantially changed, canceled, or non-renewed.

Any deductibles or self-insured retentions on referenced insurance coverages must be borne by Contractor.

The Contractor agrees that insurers waive their rights of subrogation against the Commission, its employees, elected officials, agents, or representatives and the City of Chicago.

The coverages and limits furnished by Contractor in no way limit the Contractor's liabilities and responsibilities specified within the Contract or by law.

Any insurance or self-insurance programs maintained by the Commission and the City of Chicago do not contribute with insurance provided by the Contractor under the Contract.

The required insurance to be carried is not limited by any limitations expressed in the indemnification language in this Contract or any limitation placed on the indemnity in the Contract given as a matter of law.

The Contractor must require all its subcontractors to provide the insurance required in this Contract, or Contractor may provide the coverages for its subcontractors. All its subcontractors are subject to the same insurance requirements of Contractor unless otherwise specified in this Contract.

If Contractor or its subcontractors desires additional coverage, the party desiring the additional coverage is responsible for the acquisition and cost.

RISK MANAGEMENT

The Commission's Risk Management Department maintains the rights to modify, delete, alter or change these requirements.

III. PROPOSAL SUPPORT DOCUMENTS

A. Basis of Award (Award Criteria)

To promote the intended goal of economic opportunity and maximize the use of minority personnel on this project, the Public Building Commission of Chicago has established the Award Criteria formula for the purpose of evaluating proposals and awarding the contract. A contract in the amount of the total Base Bid or Base Contract Price will be awarded to the responsible bidder with the lowest Award Criteria Figure. The Public Building Commission of Chicago reserves the right to check all calculations for accuracy. The fulfillment of the Award Criteria does not abrogate the responsibilities of the Contractor to comply with federal and state requirements under the Equal Employment Act and the Illinois Human Rights Act.

1. <u>Instructions</u>

The Bidder shall complete the Award Criteria Formula and transfer the final Award Criteria Figure - Line 15 to the space provided on the itemized proposal sheet. Failure to complete the formula may be cause for rejection of the Bidder's proposal. The successful bidder will be held responsible for adhering to the figures submitted in Lines 1, 2, 4, 6, 8, 10 and 12 during construction of the project.

Lines 2, 4 and 6 in the formula shall not be greater than fifty percent (50%) in each category for the sole purpose of determining award of the contract. Similarly, lines 8, 10 and 12 shall not be greater than ten (10%) percent in each category for the purpose of award criteria only. The fifty percent (50%) and ten percent (10%) goals are not intended to restrict the total number of minority and female employees to be used on the project, but only to establish limiting figures for use in the formula. Journeyworker includes journeyworkers from the major trades listed herein, and the teamsters. Watchmen and custodial workers are not creditable in the formula.

3. Community Hiring Bonuses

In order to encourage maximum employment of interested and available residents of the project community on this project, the following bonus calculations shall apply:

- a) In calculating the hours worked by minority and women journeyworkers, apprentices, and laborers under the Award Criteria set out in Part III.A. "Basis of Award (Award Criteria)," all hours worked by minority and women journeyworkers, existing apprentices, and laborers who are residents of the project community shall be multiplied by 1.5.
- b) In calculating the hours worked by minority and women apprentices under the Award Criteria set out in Part III "Proposal Support Documents," all hours worked in new apprenticeships by minority and women apprentices who are residents of the project community shall be multiplied by 2.0.

Definitions

"Actual residents of the City of Chicago" shall mean persons domiciled within the City of Chicago. The domicile is an individual's one and only true, fixed, and permanent home and principal establishment.

"Residents of the project community" shall mean persons domiciled within the Ward in which the Site is located.

"New Apprenticeship" shall mean an apprenticeship begun for a person who has not held an apprenticeship card within ninety (90) days prior to beginning the project.

4. Liquidated Damages

The Contractor hereby consents and agrees that, in the event that it fails to comply with each of the minimum commitments submitted with this Proposal on Lines 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, and 12 of the Award Criteria Formula, covering minority and female Journeyworkers, apprentices, and laborers respectively, the following shall apply.

If the total hours in any category for which a percentage is assigned in Lines 2, 4, 6, 8, 10, or 12 of the Award Criteria equals zero at the completion of the work, then a net deficiency of the entire percentage assigned will be deemed to exist. For any net deficiency in each category, the following amounts shall be deducted as liquidated damages from monies due the Contractor and the Contract Sum modified accordingly:

a) For each full one (1%) percent deficiency of minority Journeyworkers not utilized – seventeen and ninety three hundredths cents per each hundred dollars of the base bid calculated as follows:

Line 1 x 0.1793 100

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Each one (1%) percent deficiency toward the goal for female Journeyworkers (Line 8) shall be calculated in the same way.

b) For each full one (1%) percent deficiency of minority apprentices not utilized – sixteen and ninety three hundredths cents per hundred dollars of the base bid calculated as follows:

Line 1 x 0.1693 100

Each one (1%) percent deficiency toward the goal for female apprentices (Line 10) shall be calculated in the same way.

c) For each one (1%) percent deficiency of minority laborers not utilized – fourteen and ninety three hundredths cents per each hundred dollars of the base bid calculated as follows:

> Line 1 x 0.1493 100

Each one (1%) percent deficiency toward the goal for female laborers (Line 12) shall be calculated in the same way.

- d) Liquidated damages, if any, will be calculated for the first pay requests reflecting fifty percent (50%) completion, seventy-five percent (75%) completion, and ninety percent (90%) completion, respectively, based upon the Contractor's pay request together with all attendant certified payrolls and other required documentation of minority and women employment. The accrued liquidated damages and interest will be added to the retention provided elsewhere in this contract. The amount of liquidated damages due to the Commission under this provision will bear compound interest at the rate of 5% per annum, compounded monthly from the date of the Notice to Proceed to the date of approval of a deductive change order for liquidated damages. Should the total amount of liquidated damages due under all provisions of this contract exceed the amount of the Commission's retainage, compound interest on the amount over and above the retainage will continue to accrue until the entire amount of liquidated damages and compound interest is paid to the Commission.
- e) The Commission is aware that certain subcontract agreements under this contract may require subcontractors to contribute to payment of liquidated damages assessed under this provision. Should enforcement of subcontract liquidated damages provisions result in an aggregate total of subcontractor liquidated damages greater than the liquidated damages assessed hereunder against Contractor, then Contractor must pay the excess pro rata as a bonus to each subcontractor exceeding its subcontract commitments for minority or women employment, or both.

5. Reporting

In accordance with this commitment, the Contractor must submit both the Contractor's Payroll Record Form and the Contractor's Recapitulation of Minority and Female Worker Hours and Percentages Form on a monthly basis. All Subcontractors shall be listed on the Contractor's Recapitulation Form whether active or not. For the purpose of this report, the following group categories will be used:

- b) The classification "Black" or "African-American" includes persons having origins in any of the black racial groups of Africa.



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V. INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

A. Examination Of Documents By Bidder

- 1. The Bidder shall, before submitting its bid, carefully examine all Contract Documents, including but not limited to, the Standard Terms and Conditions (Book 1); Project Information, Instructions, and Execution Documents (Book 2); Technical Specifications (Book 3); plans; drawings; Addenda (if any); and bonds. The Bidder shall inspect in detail the site of the proposed Work and familiarize itself with all the local conditions affecting the Contract and the detailed requirements of construction. If its bid is accepted, the bidder will be responsible for all errors in its proposal resulting from failure or neglect to comply with these instructions. In no case will the Commission be responsible for any change in anticipated profits resulting from such failure or neglect.
- 2. Unless otherwise provided in the Contract, when the plans or specifications include information pertaining to subsurface exploration, borings, test pits, and other preliminary investigation, such information represents the opinion of the Commission as to the location, character, or quantity of the materials encountered and is only included for the convenience of the Bidder. The Commission assumes no responsibility with respect to the sufficiency or accuracy of the information, and there is no guaranty, either expressed or implied, that the conditions indicated are representative of those existing throughout the work, or that unanticipated developments may not occur.

B. Interpretations Or Addenda

- 1. The Commission will not furnish oral interpretations of Contract Documents. If an interpretation is desired by a prospective Bidder, the interpretation should be requested in a letter addressed to the Owner's Representative named in the Advertisement for Bids. Any inquiry received ten (10) or more days prior to the date fixed for opening of bids will be considered. Every interpretation or revision will be in the form of an addendum to the Contract Documents and, when issued, will be on file in the office of the Commission at least five (5) days before bids are opened. Although all addenda will be mailed to each person obtaining Contract Documents, it shall be the Bidder's responsibility to inquire as to the addenda issued. All such addenda shall become part of the Contract and attached thereto and all Bidders shall be bound by such addenda, whether or not received by the Bidders.
- 2. If any such differences or conflicts are not called to the Commission's Representative's attention ten (10) days or more prior to submission of bids, the Commission's Representative shall decide which of the conflicting requirements will govern, and the Contractor shall perform the work at no additional cost to the Commission in accordance with the decision of the Commission's Representative.

C. Inspection Of Site

Bidder shall inspect the Site to become familiar with the conditions relating to the Work to be performed, the facilities involved, and the difficulties and restrictions attending the performance of this Contract. Failure of the Bidder to visit the Site shall not relieve or alter the Bidder's responsibility of completing the Work as set forth in the Contract Documents.

D. Pre-Qualification Of Bidders

1. Unless otherwise indicated in Part I "Project Information," the Commission has heretofore issued Request for Qualifications (RFQ) in order to approve the qualifications of firms to perform work on certain projects of the Commission. Responses to the RFQ were evaluated by the Commission on the basis of the firm's experience and past performance, technical qualifications, organization and equipment, financial resources, bonding and insurance capacity, and other factors deemed relevant by the Commission. Notice of pre-qualification has been provided by the Commission to all firms approved as "pre-qualified," and only firms that have received notification of pre-qualification are eligible to bid on this Contract. Moreover, a firm that has been pre-qualified as a separate entity (e.g.

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sole proprietor, partnership, or corporation) is not eligible to submit a bid for this Contract as a joint venture with another pre-qualified firm unless such joint venture has been notified of its pre-qualification.

2. The Commission reserves the right to take such steps as it deems necessary to determine the continuing qualifications of the Bidder to adequately perform the requirements of the Contract, and the Bidder shall furnish to the Commission all information and data requested for this purpose, including completed form "Statement of Bidder's Qualifications" provided with this Book 2. Failure of the Bidder to cooperate with the Commission in its investigation or submit any additional documents requested by the Commission shall be grounds for disqualification.

E. Competency of Bidder

- 1. The Commission reserves the right to refuse to award a Contract to any person, firm, or corporation that is in arrears or is in default to the Commission upon any debt or contract, or that is a defaulter, as surety or otherwise, upon any obligation to the Commission, or had failed to perform faithfully any previous contract with the Commission.
- 2. The Bidder, if requested, must present within a reasonable time, as determined by the Commission, evidence satisfactory to the Commission of performance ability and possession of necessary facilities, pecuniary resources, and adequate insurance to comply with the terms of these specifications and Contract Documents.

F. Preparation of Bid

- 1. Two (2) copies of Project Information, Instructions, and Execution Documents (Book 2) shall be prepared with original signatures and notarizations wherever required.
- 2. All bids must be prepared on forms supplied by the Commission and shall be subject to all requirements of the Contract Documents. Unless otherwise stated, all blank spaces on the bid page or pages, applicable to the subject specification, should be correctly filled in. All bids must be regular in every respect and no interlineations, excisions or special conditions shall be made by the Bidder.
- 3. The Bidder's name, address, telephone and fax number should be clearly written on the front cover of each of the copies of Book 2 submitted.
- 4. When required by the Contract Documents, the Bidder may attach supporting documentation or additional information to the back of the form to which it refers.
- 5. The Commission may consider as irregular, and at its option reject, any bid on which there is an alteration of or departure from the bid form hereto attached.

G. Bid Guarantee: Deposit and Time Period

- 1. The Bid must be accompanied by a bid guarantee in the amount set forth in Part I.A. "General Project Information" to ensure:
 - a. Non-withdrawal of the bid after date and time of opening.
 - b. The furnishing of the Performance and Payment Bond and evidence of the required insurance coverage by the successful Bidder as required by the Contract Documents.
- 2. The guarantee shall be made by bid bond, certified check or cashier's check payable to the order of the Public Building Commission of Chicago. No bid will be considered unless it is accompanied by the required guarantee. Cash deposits will not be accepted.

S. Statement of Bidder's Qualifications

Each Bidder shall have on file in the office of the Commission at the time of bid opening a fully executed Statement of Bidder's Qualifications or a Qualification Submittal in response to a Request for Qualifications (RFQ). The Commission reserves the right to request additional information regarding the capability of the Bidder to perform the Contract.

T. Disclosure of Retained Parties

The apparent low Bidder and the apparent 2nd low bidder shall submit a fully executed Disclosure of Retained Parties pursuant to the instructions on the document.

U. Submission of Bid

- Two (2) copies of all bid documents with original signatures shall be enclosed in two (2) envelopes each (outer and inner), both of which shall be sealed and clearly labeled with "BID DOCUMENTS," the Contract number, name of Bidder, and date and time of opening.

Telephonic or oral modifications will not be considered. Bidders are cautioned that modifications which are not explicit and which are in any sense subject to misinterpretation shall make the bid so modified or amended subject to rejection.

V. Withdrawal Of Bids Before Bid Opening

Any Bidder may withdraw its bid by letter, facsimile, telegraphic request, or by personally securing, with proper identification, the submitted bid proposal at any time prior to the time fixed for opening of bids. A telephonic request to withdraw a bid will not be considered.

W. Opening Of Bids

At the time and place fixed for the opening of bids, the Commission will cause to be opened and publicly read aloud every bid received within the time set for receiving bids irrespective of any irregularities therein. Bidders and other persons properly interested may be present in person or by representative.

X. Evaluation of Bids

- The Commission reserves the right to check all calculations and to correct all extensions in case of
 error in order to determine the correct amount of the Total Base Bid and/or the total amount of any
 other schedule required. Errors in the bid breakdown may result in a non-responsive bid.
- 2. If a discrepancy occurs in an amount written both in words and in figures, the amount written in words will prevail.
- 3. Along with reviewing the calculations of each bid, the Commission will evaluate each Bidder's responsiveness to all Bid requirements and responsibility.

Y. Award Of Contract; Rejection Of Bids

- 1. The Contract will be awarded to the responsible Bidder submitting the lowest Award Criteria, as defined herein, complying with the conditions set forth in the Contract Documents. However, if the local business preference is applicable, the determination of the lowest responsible bidder will be made after a two percent (2%) local business preference is applied to the Award Criteria of all Bidders that do not meet the conditions defined in Section 21.18 "Local Business Preference."
- 2. The Bidder to whom the award is made will be notified at the earliest possible date.
- 3. Upon award of Contract, the Commission will process the Contract for final execution.
- 4. The Commission reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive any informality in bids received whenever it determines such rejection or waiver is in its interest.

Z. Performance and Payment Bond and Insurance

 Upon approval by the Commission to award, and within five (5) days after being given notice, the successful Bidder shall execute and deliver to the Commission the Performance and Payment Bond in the form included in the Contract Documents and evidence of the required insurance coverage.

- 2. The Performance and Payment Bond shall be in the form herein and in the full amount of the Base Contract Price and shall be security for the faithful performance of the Contract and payment of all persons, firms, or corporations to whom the Contractor may become legally indebted for labor, material, facilities or services of any nature, employed or used by it in performing the Work. The current power of attorney for the persons who sign for any surety company shall be attached to such bond. Such power of attorney shall be sealed and certified with a "first hand signature" by an officer of the surety. A facsimile signature will not be accepted by the Commission. The Commission reserves the right to approve the surety company.
- 3. The failure of the successful Bidder to supply the required Performance and Payment Bond or evidence of the required insurance coverage within five (5) days of notice, or within such extended period as the Commission may grant based upon reasons determined sufficient by the Commission, shall constitute a default and the Commission may either award the Contract to the next lowest responsible bidder or re-advertise for bids. The difference between the amount of its bid and the amount for which a contract for the work is subsequently executed may be charged against the Bidder, irrespective of whether the amount thus due exceeds the amount of the bid security. If a more favorable bid is received by re-advertising, the defaulting Bidder shall have no claim against the Commission for a refund. Because of the difficulty of ascertaining the damage caused to the Commission, such sum shall be considered liquidated damages and shall not constitute a penalty. The election by the Commission to grant an extension to the period allowed for the bidder to provide an acceptable performance and payment bond and/or evidence of insurance coverage shall not entitle the bidder to an extension of time required to complete the Work.

BB.Protests

- 1. The bidder shall submit any protests or claims regarding this solicitation to the office of the Commission's Executive Director. A pre-bid protest must be filed five (5) days before the bid opening date, a pre-award protest must be filed no later than ten (10) days after the bid opening date, and a post-award protest must be filed no later than ten (10) days after the award of the Contract.
- All protests or claims must set forth the name and address of the protester, the Contract number, the
 grounds for the protest or claim, and the course of action that the protesting party desires that the
 Executive Director take.

COOK COUNTY

TRUCK DRIVERS (WEST) - That part of the county West of Barrington Road.

The following list is considered as those days for which holiday rates of wages for work performed apply: New Years Day, Memorial/Decoration Day, Fourth of July, Labor Day, Veterans Day, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day. Generally, any of these holidays which fall on a Sunday is celebrated on the following Monday. This then makes work performed on that Monday payable at the appropriate overtime rate for holiday pay. Common practice in a given local may alter certain days of celebration such as the day after Thanksgiving for Veterans Day. If in doubt, please check with IDOL.

EXPLANATION OF CLASSES

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS ELECTRICIAN - Installation, operation, inspection, maintenance, repair and service of radio, television, recording, voice sound vision production and reproduction, telephone and telephone interconnect, facsimile, data apparatus, coaxial, fibre optic and wireless equipment, appliances and systems used for the transmission and reception of signals of any nature, business, domestic, commercial, education, entertainment, and residential purposes, including but not limited to, communication and telephone, electronic and sound equipment, fibre optic and data communication systems, and the performance of any task directly related to such installation or service whether at new or existing sites, such tasks to include the placing of wire and cable and electrical power conduit or other raceway work within the equipment room and pulling wire and/or cable through conduit and the installation of any incidental conduit, such that the employees covered hereby can complete any job in full.

MARBLE FINISHER

Loading and unloading trucks, distribution of all materials (all stone, sand, etc.), stocking of floors with material, performing all rigging for heavy work, the handling of all mateiral that may be needed for the installation of such materials, building of scaffolding, polishing if needed, patching, waxing of material if damaged, pointing up, caulking, grouting and cleaning of marble, holding water on diamond or Carborundum blade or saw for setters cutting, use of tub saw or any other saw needed for preparation of material, drilling of holes for wires that anchor material set by setters, mixing up of molding plaster for installation of material, mixing up thin set for the installation of material, mixing up of sand to cement for the installatin of material and such other work as may be required in helping a Marble Setter in the handling of all material in the erection or installation of interior marble, slate, travertine, art marble, serpentine, alberene stone, blue stone, granite and other stones (meaning as to stone any foreign or domestic materials as are specified and used in building interiors and experiors and customarily known as stone in the trade), carrara, sanionyx, vitrolite and similar opaque glass and the laying of all marble tile, terrazzo tile, slate tile and precast tile, steps, risers treads, base, or any other materials that may be used as substitutes for any of the aforementioned materials and which are used on interior and experior

which sare installed in a similar manner.

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of sand, cement, marble chips, and all other materials that may be used by the Mosaic Terrazzo Mechanic, and the mixing, grinding, grouting, cleaning and sealing of all Marble, Mosaic, and Terrazzo work, floors, base, stairs, and wainscoting by hand or machine, and in addition, assisting and aiding Marble, Masonic, and Terrazzo Mechanics.

TRAFFIC SAFETY

Work associated with barricades, horses and drums used to reduce lane usage on highway work, the installation and removal of temporary lane markings, and the installation and removal of temporary road signs.

Furthermore, specifications section "09686-Carpet Tile" is included in the contract documents. The only location shown on the drawings to receive carpet tile is in Control Room 105. Shall we assume the floor plan is correct? And that control room 105 shall receive carpet tile?

Answer 1:

The Room Finish Schedule on Drawing A-37 does not, but should call out carpet tile for Control Room 105. Drawing A-3 correctly shows the extent of the carpet tile that is called out in the specification.

Question 2:

Note 1 on drawing G8 state the sidewalks are not shown for clarity. The only drawings we find sidewalks on are on A3 and A42 around the building. There are no sidewalks around the road or parking lots. Is this correct?

Answer 2:

New sidewalks are shown on Drawings A3 and A42. There are no new sidewalks around the roads or parking lots.

Question 3:

Note 5 on drawing G8 refers to drawing G13 for signage location. However, other than pavement markings for handicap ramps. Where do we find the sign locations?

Answer 3:

Drawing G13 shows signage locations for car pool / van pool and electric vehicle parking. Book 3 Specification Section 10436 provides requirements for these signs and for handicapped parking signs. Locate handicapped parking signs similar to locations shown for car pool / van pool and electric vehicle parking signs.

Drawing G13 indicates that the roadway and west parking lot pavement is to be continuously reinforced 8" concrete pavement. This is very unusual and we would like verification that this is the correct pavement section.

Answer 4:

The roadway and west parking lot pavement is to be concrete pavement as shown on Drawing G13

Question 5:

Can the full time staff member referred to in Book 1 be a member of subcontractor staff or does this full time member need to be employed by the general contractor? If the general contractor is required to staff this position, can this task be performed by the project manager?

Answer 5:

The mechanical and electrical coordinator needs to be in the employment of General Contractor. Per specifications Section 01010, Item 3.6 "the individual(s) has the sole responsibility for this service". It cannot be the project manager.

Question 6:

Note 4 on drawing G8 refers to Specification Section 01110 for harbor permit requirements. There is no Section 01110 in our specifications.

Answer 6:

There is no Specification Section 01110. No harbor permit is required.

Question 7:

Specification 02317 Part 2.2.A does not reference crushed concrete as a material for select fill. Will crushed concrete meeting the select fill gradation be allowed?

Answer 7:

Sound crushed concrete meeting specified requirements is acceptable as select fill under Specification Section 02317 Part 2.2A.

Question 8:

For Unit Price Item No. 3 — "Furnish and install production steel H-piles complete in place as shown specified (See Book 3 Section 01020)" no definition of measurement for payment is given. It is implied in 01020 Part 3.P.1 that the Commission's Representative will determine the lengths of the piles to be furnished after the pile load tests. The Contractor will then order the piles based on the lengths from the Commission's Representative and payment will be based on the ordered length. Is this the correct interpretation for this item? Also, since the pile are to be driven to rock, how will payment be made if individual piles, ordered to the Commission's Representative length, do not hit rock due to variation in the rock elevation and pile spices are required? Will the splice and the additional material be paid per Section 15.03-Payment for Changes?

Answer 8:

Production Steel H-Piles will be paid for in accordance with Contract Item No. 3. Book 3 Specification Section 01020 describes Work included under Contract Item No. 3 including measurement for payment.

Question 9:

It is the understanding of the documents that if the contractor is non-compliant for the City residency at 50%, 75% and 90% completions, the contractor will be assessed liquidated damages plus 5% compound interest on the damages. Due to composition of the trades, it may occur that at these interim evaluation periods, we may be non-compliant, but at the end of succeeding periods and the end of the project we may meet or exceed the residency requirements. Will the damages assessed at the interim points be returned to the contractor? If the damages are returned, will the contractor earn 5% interest for the penalty similar to the Owner?

Answer 9:

The contractor will not actually be assessed damages at those intervals; therefore compound interest does not apply. If necessary, liquidated damages will be assessed at 100% completion. "For the purpose of adjusting the level of retainage the Commission will review compliance at 50%, 75%, 90% completion of the Work". Based on the level of compliance at those

intervals the PBC may hold in retainage sufficient funds to cover potential liquidated damages. Should the potential damages decrease those funds will be released from retainage. No interest will be assessed by the PBC and none given to the contractor based on the level of retainage.

Question 10:

Section 3.4 of Specification 07530, Thermoplastic Sheet Roofing, calls for all existing roofing, base flashing, and deteriorated wood blocking or deteriorated metal flashings to be removed at the existing chemical building. Does this mean the contractors are to replace the existing roof on the entire building? If not please specify the areas of roofing that are to be removed and re-roofed.

Answer 10:

The Contractor is not to replace the existing roof on the entire existing chemical building. Drawing A5, INTERMEDIATE FLOOR PLAN AND PIPE GALLERY +44 indicates the areas the contractor is to replace. Notes indicating hatched areas at column penetrations and under the pipe gallery show the intended areas of intervention. If during construction of the gallery, larger areas or areas of the roofing different than the ones indicated are damaged, the contractor is to replace them under the requirement of Specification section 07530 to match the existing roofing.

Deletion #2:

Delete the current text in Specification, 07530.3.4.A and replace it with the following:

"General Criteria: All existing roofing, base flashing, wood blocking or metal flashings damaged during construction of the pipe gallery shall be removed and replaced to match existing roofing and restore drain ability. Remove only that amount of roofing and flashing which can be made weather tight with new materials during a one-day period or before the onset of inclement weather."

Question 11:

There is a discrepancy between Drawings S5 through S11 and the column schedule on Drawing S34. Details 2/S5 and 3/S5 indicate the columns between elevation 14'-0" to 32' - 0" are either 12" square or 16" square. The column schedule on S34 shows the columns as 18" square or 24" square. The column rebar are also inconsistent. This conflict also exists between the other floors. Please clarify which are the correct column dimensions.

Answer 11:

The two-12x12 columns shown on Detail 2/S5, and one-16x16 column shown on Detail 3/S5 are not included in the column schedule on Drawing S34. The information shown on these two details applies to only these three columns.

In the same way, Detail 1/S8 shown on Drawing S8 applies to only the two-12-in.sq. Columns shown on Plan, Drawing S8 and also shown on Section 1/S15. The 12-in.sq. columns (10 thus) shown on Section 3/S11 are for columns shown on Plan, Drawing S11. These columns are also not included in the column schedule on Drawing S34.

Question 12:

Specification 02458 Part 1.5 requires seismic monitoring for the pile driving. Are there general locations or a number of monitoring sites that are required?

Answer 12:

Monitoring station locations are not shown on the Drawings. ADD the following to Section 02458 Part 1.5 B.: "Provide three monitoring sites in the existing Chemical Building north of the new Chlorine Building. Locate the monitoring stations along the inside of the exterior south wall of the Chemical Building with one station near each corner and one in the middle.

If during construction of the gallery, larger areas or areas of the roofing different than the ones indicated are damaged, the contractor is to replace them under the requirement of Specification Section 07530 to match the existing roofing". Specification 07530.3.4.A as replaced in Addendum No. 3 to "General Criteria: All existing roofing, base flashing, wood blocking or metal flashings damaged during construction of the pipe gallery shall be removed and replaced to match existing roofing and restore drain ability".

During our site visit we observed that the roof over the existing chemical building has many blisters in the area of new walkway and the entire area south of Q, and is probably near the end of its useful life. Even if means are taken to protect the existing roof at the end of construction. In addition, it will be very difficult, if not impossible, and very expensive to try to repair or replace the existing building's roof under the pipe gallery and supporting truss at a later date. We believe it is in the Owner's best interest to replace the existing roof, at a minimum under the pipe gallery and supporting structure, and probably the entire area south of Q to ensure a watertight roof. Please clarify how we are to proceed.

Answer 2:

Proceed in accordance with the Contract Documents and prior Addendum responses.

Question 3:

Drawing A5 states "Remove existing limestone and anchors up to El. 55'-4" +/-". Is this a

mortar joint or do we need to saw cut the existing limestone at this elevation?

Answer 3:

On drawing A5 replace all instances of the note stating: "Remove existing limestone and anchors up to El 55'-4" with "Remove existing limestone and anchors up to El 58'-3" or nearest horizontal joint"

Question 9:

Specification 1519.1.2.3B requires the lead booster to start upon falling gas pressure. This is not the best way to energize the lead booster. The pressure can oscillate and the booster could cycle. The usual way this is done is to use a low voltage signal from the burners, assuming they are the only recipient of the booster supply. If there are multiple demands for the booster gas, we would simply let one booster run continuously and include a 24/7 timer to rotate the lead machine every day or week. Please review and advise what is required.

Answer 9:

The boosters operate on signals from equipment listed in specification section 15900, paragraph 3.4.W.1.d. Signal from emergency generator should also be included in that paragraph. Gas pressure dead band of 5

The recommended Ashcroft Corrison Data Guide indicates the following:

Is the scale on Drawing M13 correct? It is a long distance down the corridors." The scale shown is correct.

Question 20

Drawing E17 -Main Electrical Switchgear Control Room EL 13'-6" shows four conduits exiting the east building wall adjacent to columns JJ and HH and heading north to the ground field. The indication is that these conduits are to be buried. Actually, the area east of the building wall is part of the intake structure, and has water in it. It would be very difficult for the contractors to run conduit in this area, because it would be difficult to provide support over the water for safe installation. Need to clarify this. For instance can contractor run these conduits and wires inside the building to the North wall at column line PP? Or (another idea), can the grounding be connected to the existing grounding of the existing Main 2.3 KV Switchgear? Are there other alternatives?

On Drawing E17, Main Electrical Switchgear Control Room EL 13' - 6":

Delete the 4 - 1" conduits each with 1 # 1/0 ground wire need.

PART 1 GENERAL

1.1 SUMMARY

- A. Section Includes: Insulated metal panels, anchors, bolts, trim and accessories required for attachment of the Work.
- B. Related Work Specified in Other Sections Includes, But is Not Limited to, the Following:
 - 1. Section 05085 Galvanizing
 - 2. Section 05120 Structural Steel
 - 3. Section 07900 Joint Sealers

1.2 REFERENCE

- A. Codes and standards referred to in this Section are:
 - ASTM E 72 Method of Conducting Strength Tests of Panels for Building Construction
 - ASTM C 236 Test Method for Steady-State Thermal Performance of Building Assemblies by Means of a Guarded Hot Box

1.3 DESIGN REQUIREMENTS

- A. Deflection Limit: Design the metal wall panel system for a deflection limit of L/180 under a positive loading of 20 pounds per square foot and in accordance with ASTM E 72.
- B. Rating: Provide metal wall panels having a U-value of 0.069 BTU/HR/ft²/Degrees F when tested in accordance with ASTM C 236.

1.4 SUBMITTALS

- A. General: Provide all submittals, including the following, as specified in Division 1.
- B. Samples: Submit three samples illustrating finished aluminum surface for color selection and approval.

C. Shop Drawings: Show fabrication and installation layouts of metal panels; details of edge conditions, joints, panel profiles, anchorages, attachment system, trim, flashings, closures, and accessories; and special details. Distinguish between factory-, shop- and field-assembled work.

1.5 QUALITY ASSURANCE

- Installer Qualifications: An employer of workers trained and approved by manufacturer.
- 2. Source Limitations: Obtain each type of metal wall panel from single source from single manufacturer.
- 3. Support Structure Alignment: Determine that the supporting structure is aligned to tolerances acceptable to the metal wall panel manufacturer prior to installation.

1.6 PRODUCTS DELIVERY, STORAGE, AND HANDLING

- A. Deliver components, sheets, metal wall panels, and other manufactured items so as not to be damaged or deformed. Package metal wall panels for protection during transportation and handling.
- B. Unload, store, and erect metal wall panels in a manner to prevent bending, warping, twisting, and surface damage.
- C. Stack metal wall panels horizontally on platforms or pallets, covered with suitable weathertight and ventilated covering. Store metal wall panels to ensure dryness, with positive slope for drainage of water. Do not store metal wall panels in contact with other materials that might cause staining, denting, or other surface damage.
- Retain strippable protective covering on metal wall panel for period of metal wall panel installation.
- E. Protect foam-plastic insulation as follows:
 - 1. Do not expose to sunlight, except to extent necessary for period of installation and concealment.
 - 2. Protect against ignition at all times. Do not deliver foam-plastic insulation materials to Project site before installation time.

2.2 MATERIALS

- A. Panel Construction: Provide factory assembled insulated metal panels 2 inch thick and 24 inches wide with 22-gauge embossed galvanized steel face and liner panels and foam insulation core.
- B. Flashings and Trim: Provide flashings and trim connected with the panels of the same gauge, material, finish and color as adjacent panels. Include trim for openings cut through the panels, for appearance and for structural reinforcement of the panels.
- C. Fasteners: Provide Type 305 stainless steel self tapping fasteners.

2.3 FINISH

- B. Final Cleaning: Thoroughly clean panels during and after final installation.
