PUBLIC BUILDING COMMISSION OF CHICAGO MINUTES OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE OPERATIONS COMMITTEE MEETING HELD ON DECEMBER 27, 2012

The meeting of the Administrative Operations Committee of the Public Building Commission of Chicago was held in the 2nd Floor Board Room at the Richard J. Daley Center on December 27, 2012 at 1:00 p.m.

The reading of the minutes of the November 29, 2012 Administrative Operations Committee meeting, which was previously distributed, was dispensed with. Upon motion duly made and seconded the minutes of said meeting were unanimously adopted.

Erin Lavin Cabonargi, Executive Director presented the AO Committee with an intergovernmental agreement that the PBC is working on with the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District. The PBC will commence its first project for the MWRD, with a series of energy savings projects similar to the energy retrofit completed at the Richard J. Daley Center.

The Executive Director also presented the Year End Report given to the Chairman Rahm Emanuel. This 2012 report included accomplishments, performance metrics and a look-ahead to 2013.

Also discussed was ethics training that will be available this year via webinar, making training more accessible to the Commissioners.

Chairman Brazier commented that he also received information on Public Meetings Act training. Lori Lypson stated that training is managed through Attorney General Lisa Madigan's office and are offered online with a deadline date of 1/31/13.

The Executive Director also presented the bid results received for Alexander Graham Bell Elementary School Linked Annex project. Six bids were received on December 18, 2012. The bids from 6 pre-qualified, and PBC-experienced, bidders were within a tight range where Wight's high bid was less than 4% more than Walsh's low bid. All

bids were significantly higher than the PBC's independent estimate. Walsh's low bid exceeded the estimate (and budget) by almost 15%. PBC completed a re-assessment of the Project Budget to determine whether funds could be re-allocated within the budget so that an award of to the low Bidder. PBC advised CPS that we could make an interim revision to the budget that would enable us to make an award, but that additional funds would be required to complete the required work. Preliminary estimate of additional funds required is \$500,000 (or a revised total project budget of \$10,500,000).

Chairman Brazier requested clarification on the consent order filed with Attorney General's Office regarding Daley Center building audit and IEPA permit fees. Commissioner Randall asked if the PBC received any media inquiries regarding the consent order. Erin Lavin Cabonargi clarified the request and noted that the PBC received two inquiries. The reports from the Executive Director were accepted.
